## **FATHER KEN'S CORNER**



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

We enter into a New Year of 2024 with joy and anticipation. Yet I'm willing to guess that many of us will continue to write down '2023' when writing checks and paying bills. But the old year is ended, and I suppose that some of the toys and gifts received on the morning of Christmas are now a little old as well. In the past week, we know there are any number of Christmas trees sitting at the curb, waiting to be taken away. The lighted decorations are no longer turned on at dusk and the youngsters are back in school with just a few more days before our college students return to campus. The Christmas music is regretfully put away until next year and our manger scenes with Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and the Magi are all packed up. The cycle of life eases a bit even as the liturgy of the church gears down to observe Ordinary Time.

ORDINARY TIME may not sound very special or very celebratory, but this time, what some people might consider bland or uninteresting, possesses its own special character. For good or for ill, we can allow this period of days before Lent to become routine and no different from years past OR we can seize the day and make some changes – beyond the New Year's resolutions that may already have become as discarded as a broken toy. ORDINARY TIME should not be an excuse for not bringing about the **extraordinary** in our lives.

It seems that war has become an ordinary feature in the life of the world. For close to two years now, the Ukrainians have been defending their homeland, their sovereign state from the Russian invaders. It has become "ordinary' for one side (Putin and his gang) to kill (perhaps murder is a more accurate word) innocent civilians, to kidnap children from their towns and families to indoctrinate them with lies – just as these leaders have lied to the people of their own country. If the violence in the Middle East was not an 'ordinary' aspect as life in the past, presently the strife between Israel and Hamas, the suffering among both the Jewish hostages taken in October and the Palestinian refugees who have been bombed out of their home, has become their 'ordinary' life. Do we want or accept this as the "new normal"?

In our own country what once was shocking has become 'ordinary' news. Federal, state and local officials, judges, their staff, news organizations and their reporters for being threatened with violence - just for doing their jobs. There is that violent and, in my opinion, UNAMERICAN contingent of our fellow citizens who lash out with extremism when results do not go their way and when news that they don't like is reported. The violence of mass shootings – and they don't all don't make the news anymore – occurs in this country – EVERY SINGLE DAY OF THE YEAR. You and I can debate (and we should debate in a civilized manner) what our nation's policy should be on an entire range of issues. They need to be addressed in light of the upcoming national and statewide elections. At the same time. the security and the inviolability of the ballot box no longer seems to be sacrosanct. So much of what was once the ORDINARY WAY of American life no longer seems to hold.

ORDINARY TIME in the church offers us an opportunity to take what some may see as undistinctive and transform the 'ordinary' into the possibility of becoming better or special. If we unthinkingly continue to accept and are uncritical of the routine which surrounds us, we become more and more unable to change in our personal, public and spiritual lives. And as we all know, change is necessary for growth.

In the upcoming space of ORDINARY TIME, I offer an opportunity for the women of the parish to come together in an 'extraordinary' way for a day of reflection and prayer on Saturday 27 January from noon to 4pm. Back in the fall, there was a day of prayer for men; now our theme for women will be – Jesus, Peace in our hearts. Details can be found in today's and future bulletins. May that Peace of Christ become an "ordinary" aspect of their lives.

# Good News!

January 14, 2024

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) 1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19 / 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20 / John 1:35-42

#### FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

"What are you looking for?" asks Jesus of the two disciples who come to see who he is and what he is about. They are Jesus' first words in John's Gospel, and that's what the entire Gospel of John is about, an answer to that piercing question.

I spent the week living with that question, never really finding an answer that seemed to fit, or perhaps I got too many answers, all of them somehow falling short. Why do I spend an hour early each morning sitting in the silence? I read some Scripture, but then mostly I sit with the silence. Many are the times when my mind drifts to other times and places and daydreams. Sometimes the silence is scattered with boredom; at other times it stumbles with prayerful words; and sometimes in the silence I look for answers to the plaguing whys of life. Mostly, though, I sit in the silence. I'd like to call it prayer, but then I wonder if I'm simply floundering in wishful thinking. So I return to that haunting question—"What are you looking for?"

I think perhaps the answer is similar to what I look for when I gather with friends. Sometimes the get-together is engaging, but not always. Sometimes it is memorable, but not always. Sometimes we just hang out, and that can be enough. Ultimately relationships keep me grounded. That also is why I spend time in the silence. It's what I'm looking for when I pray—to be in relationship with God, to be grounded lest I drift away and grow lost. •





## **Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:**

- 1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: <a href="www.Virtus.org">www.Virtus.org</a> When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.
  - a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
  - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select **Rockville Centre-Safe Environment**.
  - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
  - d. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
  - e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
  - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.

#### 2. Background Screening Application:

- a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
- b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
- c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
- d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

Our sandwiches and wash-up kits are delivered to Lighthouse Mission located at 1543 Montauk Hwy, Bellport, NY 11713.




