Third Sunday of Lent (B)

Exodus 20:1-17 or 20:1-3, 7-8, 12-17 /
1 Corinthians 1:22-25 / John 2:13-25

FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

When Jesus cleansed the temple, he cleared it of all the sacrificial animals and foreign coins that cluttered that holy place. He also shifted the focus of where we find God made present—from a building to himself. "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:19). Saint Paul tells us that we, too, are God's temple because the Holy Spirit dwells in us. So it makes sense that Jesus also wants to clear our lives of all that clutters them so that we might grow in his image.

Such decluttering happens when youthful freedom and partying are left behind because we hear some inner call to settle down and contribute to life. It happens when young couples begin to raise a family and trade in sporty cars and fashionable lifestyles for baby furniture and SUVs. It happens in middle age when in the midst of building a life we change the blueprint. The weight of illness will shift our perspectives as well, when worries about life's details turn dispensable because what we once thought was important becomes clutter in need of being cleared out.

None of this comes about because of some user manual for daily living, but rather because we sense an invitation from Jesus to reassess our lives—to join him in clearing out the clutter in order to take care of what is essential. It is a strange sort of wisdom that flows from a source deeper than ourselves. If not for that powerful force of God's Spirit clearing the temples of our lives, we would never become the people God created us to be. ●

A Note from Fr. Jerry:

It is hard to imagine, but the Lenten season is now upon us! I want to take a moment as we begin the discipline of Lent to thank our Pastoral Staff, our wonderful volunteers and all of you, our loving and faithful parishioners, for your support and prayers.

While our Pastor is away, we are all working very hard to make sure that we are doing our best to serve the needs of our people. We thank you for your patience and understanding and as you can imagine it is sometimes difficult to meet all of those needs. I'm sure you can see our staff and volunteers have joined together and are working harder than ever before, sometimes for many extra hours, to achieve our goals for Good Shepherd. I know we can count on your continued prayers and support!

Parishioners have been asking for clarification on **ABSTINENCE AND FASTING** for the Lenten Season. The following comes from the notes given each year to our parishes from our Bishop:

"All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to observe the laws of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. Those whose work or health would be impaired are excused from fast and abstinence. Individual conscience should decide proper cause for excuse. A more serious reason is required to excuse oneself from Ash Wednesday and Good Friday abstinence."

Remember that in addition to fasting from food, we may want to fast from other things like gossip, abusing food or drink, pulling back from our electronics, making harsh judgements against our neighbor or withholding forgiveness.

We are also challenged to **GIVE** even more generously to our brother and sisters and share our resources with those truly in need. We can give more than just our finances. Our *time* is our most precious commodity. Perhaps we can forgo some of our personal time to give time to those who really could use our help!

Lastly, we are called to deepen our **PRAYER** this Lent. Try a different way of praying, maybe a different time or take on some spiritual reading that you have been putting off. (the stack of books I want to read on my desk is so high they fell over and shook the floor!) As we pray, could I suggest we top our list praying for our beautiful Country, our Church throughout the world, our special little "church in the woods" of Good Shepherd, and please God... for peace.

Liturgical Minister Training—Spring 2024

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This “BASIC” training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One must attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A **Lector Workshop** is available for both new and experienced lectors.

A letter from your pastor will be required to reserve your space at any of these trainings and must be received at least five days prior to the session you wish to attend. Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: www.Virtus.org

When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.

- a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
- b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select **Rockville Centre-Safe Environment**.
- c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
- d. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
- e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
- f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.

2. Background Screening Application:

- a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
- b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. **DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION!** If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
- c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
- d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

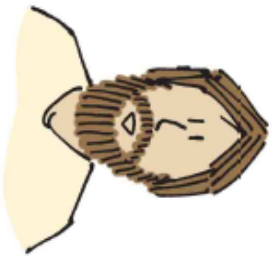

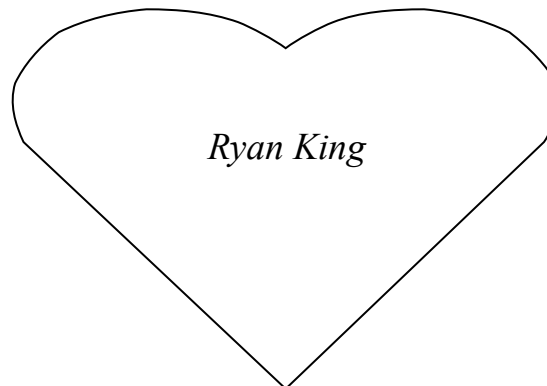
