FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

Today we celebrate PENTECOST – the 50th and final day of the Easter Season. Today we look back at the incredible wonder of God's love for us. At the Last Supper, Jesus reminds his disciples that there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends. Yet it is to be noted that St. Paul also reminds us that in a spiritual sense, Jesus did this while we were still enemies, unreconciled with God. It is Jesus who, at that Last Supper, gives himself to us in the Institution of the Holy Eucharist. It is Jesus who promises the gift of the Father, the gift of another advocate, the Holy Spirit at that farewell gathering. It is Jesus who sheds his blood on the cross for the forgiveness of sins, reconciling us with God. It is Jesus who, through the loving power of God, fulfills his promise to his friends and rises victoriously from the dead on Easter Sunday.

Considering all of the above, I don't think we appreciate this Solemn Feast of Pentecost as greatly as we should. Today, we celebrate the gift of God's own life, God's own spirit, given to us specifically as a GIFT. Everything that God is, we receive through the power of the Holy Spirit. This gift of God's love for us is so powerfully obvious to us in the Mass and the reception of Holy Communion, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. In a physical act of receiving the host in our mouths, we have a visual image of this spiritual food becoming one within us just as physical food is incorporated within the body for its nourishment.


What isn't as obvious is that this union with God FIRST becomes possible in the sacrament of Baptism. Indeed, we see the visual sign of the pouring of water most prominently in our minds as the washing away of Original Sin, inherited from the sin of Adam and Eve. Yet, simultaneously, the visual sign of the pouring of water, is the INVISIBLE SIGN of the outpouring of the HOLY SPIRIT of God into our immortal souls. This Holy Spirit is the very bond of the perfect, everlasting love between the Father and the Son. Everything of Who and What God is beyond our intellectual understanding, everything in that perfect bond of love, is sealed within us – just as at His Baptism the Spirit of God descended upon Jesus in the form of a dove and the words were heard – This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased.

It is on PENTECOST that this final gift from God comes in the form of "a strong driving wind…and there appeared to them tongues as of fire which parted and came to rest on each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit." Throughout the Old Testament, wind and fire have been constant signs of the manifestation of God's presence to particular individuals like Moses or Elijah. Although visibly absent, it is that same Holy Spirit which we also receive in a special way within the sacrament of CONFIRMATION. Just as the apostles were given special gifts to "speak in different tongues as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim", so we too at confirmation, are given Seven Special gifts – Knowledge, Understanding, Wisdom, Counsel, Fortitude, Piety, Fear of the Lord to live and proclaim in our own tongue "the mighty acts of God."

This Sacrament of Confirmation, "confirms" both the promises made by our sponsors (Godparents) at our baptism and our personal renewal of those promises before we are anointed on the forehead with Sacred Chrism (the same oil dripped on the crown of our heads at baptism and anointing the hands of a priest in Holy Orders). It also confirms the promises God has made to us in receiving us as beloved adopted children with all the rights and privileges possessed by Jesus, the Only-begotten Son of God.

I ask you to please play for those preparing to receive this special sacrament. Our 8th graders will be confirmed by Bishop Barres this coming November, but today I also will have the special privilege of confirming adults. They have been studying and preparing for many months and I join you in those prayers that they will enjoy and revel in this moment of special union with God.

Which of these images best describes your God: gardener, friend, policeman, Santa Claus, magician, doctor, lover, parent, judge, the Force?

Theologically, God is both transcendent and immanent, up there and down here. In other words, God is powerful, majestic, awesome, and all-knowing but always close, caring for us, forgiving, and comforting. Most of us lean toward one or the other in our spirituality. Whichever image you choose will tell you something about how you usually relate to God. None of the images are necessarily right or wrong unless it locks us into relating to God in only one way.

Our tendency to relate to God as either transcendent or immanent may influence our preference for liturgical style. If we view God primarily as transcendent, we will tend to appreciate the Mass as a sacrifice, celebrated formally with processions, incense, and majestic music. If we tend to relate to God as more immanent, we will tend to appreciate the Mass as a eucharistic meal with the community gathered around the altar table singing simpler music. As God is both transcendent and immanent, we should not have to choose. The ideal liturgical style would incorporate something of both transcendence and immanence.

Today's story of Moses, who climbs Mount Sinai and there bows down in worship before God, is a story of the transcendence of God—majestic, powerful, awesome to behold. Today's gospel is of an immanent God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son, not to condemn it but to save it. ●


We remember those who fought and died for a BELIEF. We honor those who fought and died for a NECESSITY. We celebrate those who fought and died for faith in all this country stands for.
