FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

The 4th Sunday of Easter is traditionally celebrated as Good Shepherd Sunday, but next weekend, we will have the wonderful opportunity to celebrate the newest shepherd for the Diocese of Rockville Centre. On Saturday June 10th, Deacon Steven McClermon will be ordained to share in the sacred office of the Holy Priesthood of Jesus Christ, the One True, High Priest. The next day, newly ordained FATHER Steven will celebrate and preside at his First Mass of Thanksgiving here at noon. All are invited to attend these wonderful and sacred moments in his life – and after the Mass on Sunday to receive Fr. Steven's first priestly blessing during an informal reception downstairs.

In our bulletin today, on page 11, we ponder the words of Pope Francis. Our Holy Father reminded all priests at the Holy Thursday Chrism Mass this year that the priest is “anointed” by the Holy Spirit to be a wellspring of harmony. Pope Francis asks that if people do not see their priests to be those visible instruments of Christ's peace, where else can they turn. Again, Pope Francis asks, “How many people fail to approach us (priests) or keep at a distance because in the church they feel unwelcomed and unloved, regarded with suspicion and judged?”

I know the people Father Steven will be serving, will find in him, both the evangelical enthusiasm of a newly ordained priest, and a source of joy, harmony and solace. Yet how disheartening that Pope Francis should need to frame this not so subtle criticism of some priests and how I desire in my own efforts to welcome any and all who come to Good Shepherd for compassion and guidance in the name of Christ!

With the ordination of a new priest, other priests also find a moment of being uplifted and confirmed in their ministry as well. It is a day of rejoicing in the continuation of a line with reaches all the way back to the apostles. Yet even as we rejoice in having another fine young man ‘join the ranks’, I admit the moment is bitter-sweet. I am so happy for Steven (and his family) that he has heard Christ's call to ‘come, follow me and I will make you a fisher of men (and women)’. I also find it sad that Steven is the only priest who is being ordained this year to serve the people of God (you) in the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

For many years there has been only a trickle of applications asking for the ability to test and discern the vocation to priesthood. And certainly, we've been asking the question, “Why is this so?” Some wonder whether God has stopped calling men to serve in this priesthood of Jesus Christ. Some wonder if God asking the church to re-evaluate the ordination of women to the diaconate and priesthood. Some wonder if the mandate of priestly celibacy is too great a demand in today's world. I wonder if the decline in church attendance by families every Sunday is the main contributor to this lack of priestly vocations. God's call is still there, but is the call being unheard and unrecognized and perhaps unwanted with so many other possibilities available in life? Has the scandal of sexual abuse by priests a very small percentage of priests caused parents to discourage their sons from even considering the possibility of a vocation to the priesthood?

Perhaps all these reasons have been factors, some more than others. Perhaps there is something in God's plan of salvation which still remains hidden to us which will only later be revealed regarding this current lack. There is one thing I do know.

Jesus promised Peter that the gates of the underworld would never prevail against the rock of the church. Christ's “mystical body” the church will endure until his return in glory to judge the world. We all need to trust in those words, but we all also need to take responsibility for encouraging and actively promoting vocations to our sons, grandsons, godsons and those men both old and young who may be afraid of committing themselves to an enterprise which admittedly is out of favor. Let us act; let us encourage and let us trust and let us pray “if today you hear the voice of the Lord, harden not your hearts.”

Just as the darkest of nights brings out stars we might never notice otherwise, so is it that when we find ourselves lost in the dark of life's deserts, the slightest kindnesses can bring us to a brief oasis in a day otherwise oppressive. Most often such moments come as gifts, unearned—even undeserved. Yet they are blessings to us.

Psychologists tell us that if we find ourselves down in the dumps and depressed, we can find hope by naming three things that happened that day that were pure gifts—a phone call from a friend, a compliment, a free cup of coffee, a good bill of health from the doctor. Remembering them at the end of the day and giving thanks for them may not solve the issues that burden us, but they can put them in perspective, reminding us that life is a mix of both the good as well as the not so good.

Moses urged the people to recall all that God had done for them—bringing them out of Egypt, guiding them through the desert, leading them to water, and feeding them with manna. Amid their grumbling, their remembering offered them hope and the courage to go on.

Thus, what psychologists suggest is what God has been doing for us for thousands of years—that God feeds us daily in large and small ways, all without our deserving it but out of his great generosity. Remember, then, how God has fed you. ●

I am happy to announce that on the weekend of June 10/11, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the celebration of the gift of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, we will reinstitute the custom of receiving under both species of both the host and from the chalice.



As in the past, receiving from the chalice is always a PERSONAL OPTION and no one should feel pressed to receive from the chalice if you are uncomfortable for any reason. While receiving from both the consecrated host and from the chalice has powerful sign value – one always receives Jesus Christ in his entirety – in the reception of a single species.

To begin we will add just 2 additional stations for the ministers of the cup.

Dear Good Shepherd Parish Family,

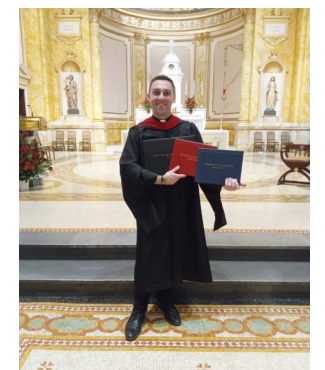

What I can provide to the parishioners:

- One home visit (if parishioner allows or requests) to listen to and assess home care needs and concerns.
- Assessment of home of: Patient safety, Need for medical equipment, Medication compliance, MD visit compliance
- Information of: How to obtain medical equipment under insurance, How to obtain home care services if warranted including visiting nurse, physical therapy, home health aide and social worker under Medicare guidelines.
- Education on: Safety precautions, Medication compliance, Nutrition
- Lend an empathetic ear to patient and caregiver concerns.
- Follow up phone call
