FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

As we celebrate this Father's Day Weekend, many of our families will gather for a BBQ where the guest of honor (Dad) may be the one doing the grilling. I'm sure we all have special memories of our dads – perhaps when he tossed us up into the air and catching us (what a total and wonderful trust we had in knowing we'd be caught), tickling us until we were screaming with laughter, playing catch with either a baseball or football or frisbee, being held in his lap as he read us a story (probably a story he read to us a dozen times previously), or simply watching television together (and pleading for one more program before bed). In this age of video games on our electronic devices, it's sad that more and more our children are retreating into a personal, private world that may leave less and less time for the bonding of girls and boys with Mom and Dad.

Parenting today is probably more difficult than in the past and being a father is probably harder than ever with all the dangers in our lives today. Not that many years ago, Moms and Dads never gave a second thought about their children being safe at school – the worst that could happen was falling in the playground during recess. Now we pray that no one invades the school with a gun. Today, any child who has access to a cell phone or the internet can be exposed to all sorts of things that are unsuitable for them. Dads and Moms somehow need to have that 6th sense in protecting their children. On this Father's Day we also celebrate the innocence and fragility of our children who provide so much love to their dads and moms. The following story may help all our fathers appreciate how delicate and needy, how loving and openhearted their children are.

Stacey loved when her dad would read a story to her. She had a large collection of picture books, torn and tattered from so much use. And her father, John, usually enjoyed sitting with her, turning page after page, reading the words, pointing at the pictures, sometimes expanding the story or making up a new one based on what they were reading. Stacey was his only child and while he tried not to spoil her, he adored her for all the joy and happiness she brought into their lives each every day.

But this day, John was distracted. There had been confirmation to the rumors that people were going to be let go at work. John suspected he was on the list as he had been with the company only a few years. He enjoyed his job, the people working with him and a comfortable salary. He worried about interviewing for a new position in a shaky economy.

When Stacey started asking him to read her a story that Saturday afternoon, he was distracted, in his own little world of worry. She asked once, twice, three times and he rejected her requests, getting more and more annoyed each time. Finally, after she asked for what seemed the umpteenth time, he snapped at her and ordered her to stop bothering him and go play outside. He didn't see the tears beading in her eyes as she slowly walked out the door. She grabbed her bicycle from the garage and still with teary eyes, started out the driveway. She never saw the car going a little too fast coming down the street.

"Come on, John", his wife Susan said for the third time, "we need to get to the church." He nodded, but still didn't move, still holding open Stacey's little book that she left on the couch before going outside. "Once upon a time there was...". John's eyes streamed with tears again. How many stories started that way with a happy ending. For John, who angry at himself for his moody insensitivity, there was no happy ending; no more stories with Stacey.

A sad story, but true all too often. Dads, if you have a small child, cherish that child, spend as much time as possible with them even when they annoy or disobey you. They grow up all too fast and there'll be a time when they're older and more independent when you can cling only to the memories of the past. **"And parents, never drive your children to resentment, but in bringing them up, correct them and guide them as the Lord does." (Ephesians 6:4).**

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time (A)

Jeremiah 20:10-13 / Romans 5:12-15 / Matthew 10:26-33

FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

The Gospel of Matthew warns that the greater danger is not about those who may kill the body, but rather it is about those who can destroy both body and soul. Indeed, what if our soul dies long before our body dies? What then has become of our living?

Henry David Thoreau spent a year at Walden Pond in 1845. He did not go to escape life, he said, but to preserve it, to live it more fully. “I went to the woods because I wished to live deliberately, to front only the essential facts of life, and see if I could not learn what it had to teach, and not when I came to die, discover that I had not lived,” he wrote in *Walden* in 1854. “I did not wish to live what was not life, living is so dear, nor did I wish to practice resignation, unless it was quite necessary. I wanted to live deep and suck out all the marrow of life, to live so sturdily and Spartan-like as to put to rout all that was not life.”

To have a soul is not as if some other-worldly reality has been given a home in our body. Rather, to have a soul is to have a source of hope even in the face of failure, to love in imitation of Jesus even when we are not loved, to see goodness even when it is hidden, to trust in God even when we are powerless. It is the source of mystery, of all that is transcendent, the home of all that is holy. ●

Are we living in a time of selfish indifference and thinking only what is good for me and my family and ignoring the common good?

***Thank you for you well– thought responses to Pope Francis’ question:
Do you believe that women have the right to decide what happens to their own bodies?
We appreciate hearing the personal opinions from our parishioners.***

**The question posed is an important and interesting one. However I feel like it was phrased in a way that I would expect from the secular media, which equates women's equality with reproductive "choice". Women's equality is so much more than that. Women should be valued and treated as equals in every arena. They should be educated, compensated for work, and have equal influence in laws and governance. This should never be confused with having the right to end a life growing within her, with it's own heart beat, brain activity and distinct DNA.*

**I believe that women have the total right to decide what happens to their own bodies.*

**Yes, women ought to be stewards of their bodies. They are responsible for their health and for their general upkeep. A woman is defined as a potential birthing person, one who is physically equipped to bear a child. Once a woman becomes pregnant though, she has an additional responsibility. She becomes the life-line for the child within her. Life is a miracle and needs to be held sacred from the moment of conception, thus the woman and her male counterpart must do everything in their power to support this child and encourage its birth. Anything less is a distortion of natural law. Women are blessed to bring life to fruition and should happily embrace this miracle. The birth of a new born is God's way of saying, "Life is worth living."*

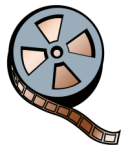

At the Movies with Donna

"Guy Ritchie's The Covenant" – An Afghan interpreter risks his own life to save an Army sergeant during the war in Afghanistan. In a departure from his usual fast-paced, stylistic films about gangsters and criminals; Guy Ritchie brings us a skillfully made, gripping story about dedication, sacrifice, survival brotherhood and friendship. As director and co-writer, Ritchie is at his finest with one of his best films. Terrific performances by Jake Gyllenhaal and Dar Salim, as well as the entire cast. The film contains some harsh scenes and violence, after all, it is about war; and at times, you will find yourself on the edge of your seat. At its core, however, it is the film's title that describes it best – "The Covenant", a bond, a pledge, a commitment.



"Guardians of the Galaxy Vol.3" – As a fan of this Marvel Comics superhero film series, I could not wait for this third and possibly last installment. This one centers around Rocket - we learn about his past as the guardians prepare to protect him from the evil High Revolutionary. Director and writer James Gunn once again does a great job in mixing the futuristic world and its strange characters with getting the audience to become fully emotionally invested in it all. Where else would you care about a space raccoon and a talking tree? Yes, a tree that only utters the same three words for everything he tries to communicate, "I am Groot" and, yet, we totally understand what he means every time. This ensemble cast, which includes Chris Pratt, Zoe Saldana, Dave Bautista, Karen Gillan, Pom Klementieff, Vin Diesel, and Bradley Cooper, is stellar. They all work so well together. And, of course, we must not forget the musical soundtrack. As with the other two films, the music helps tell the story and just adds a little more flavor to each scene. A film trilogy that deals with love, friendship, loyalty, family, doing the right thing and putting others before yourself cannot be that bad. As a matter of fact, it is a good lesson on how everyone should live together, regardless of what you look like, what you believe in and where you come from. If this truly is the final installment, I, for one, will miss these characters and their adventures. If you are a fan, enjoy the ride.

"Fast X" – In this 10th installment of "The Fast & Furious" franchise, Dominic Toretto finds his family as a target of a revengeful man who blames him for the death of his father and the loss of his family's fortune. Well directed by Louis Leterrier, with the script written by Dan Mazeau and Justin Lin. As we have come to know, there is nothing logical with this franchise, the story lines can be a bit over the top, and each film gets larger and larger with stunts you have never seen before. It is the cast, however, that includes Vin Diesel, Michelle Rodriguez, Tyrese Gibson, Chris Bridges, Sung Kang, John Cena, Brie Larson, Jason Statham, and Charlize Theron, that keeps our attention. Add in Jason Momoa, who is so over the top as the psychopath avenging his father's death, and the incomparable Rita Moreno, who plays Toretto's grandmother, and you have another entertaining movie.

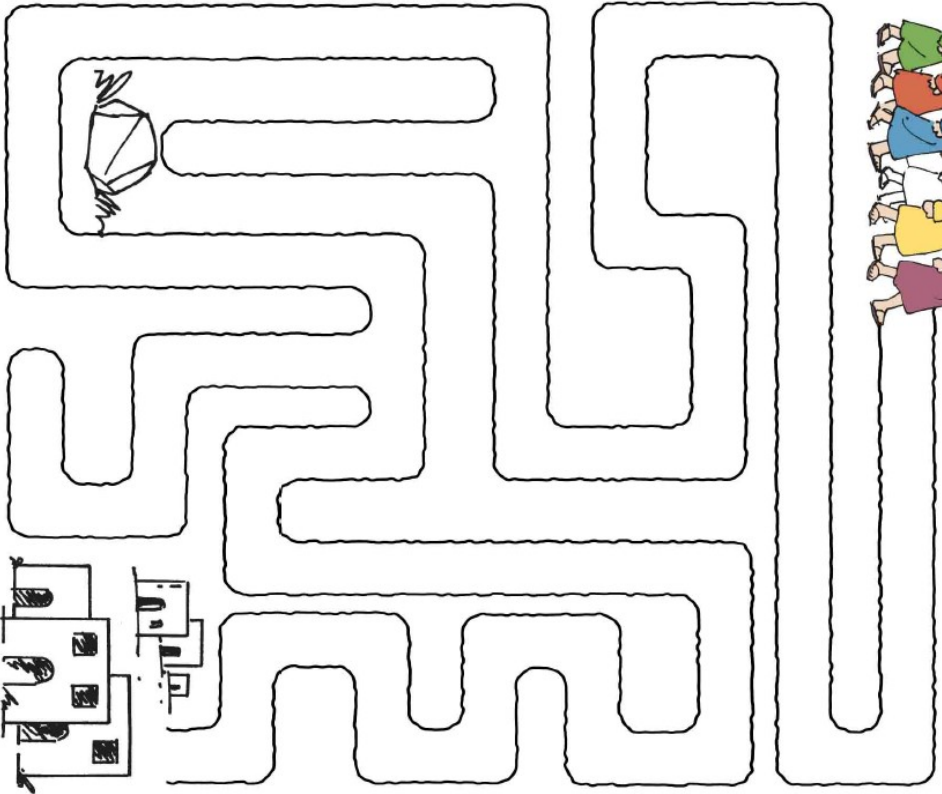
"About My Father" – A man and his father spend the weekend with his wealthy fiancée's family. Co-written by comedian Sebastian Maniscalco and Austen Earl, this story is based on Maniscalco's relationship with his father. Nicely directed by Laura Terruso. Maniscalco and Robert De Niro have great chemistry as father and son. As funny as this movie is, it also is endearing and heart-warming. Two families that are so different from each other can actually find themselves coming together as one. "Family isn't one important thing, it is everything." A la familia!

"The Little Mermaid" – In this live-action adaptation of the Disney animated film that stole our hearts in 1989, Ariel is the young beautiful mermaid with a desire to explore the human world and while doing so, falls in love with the handsome Prince. Sounds like every girl's dream, mermaid or not. This musical is expertly directed by Rob Marshall with a well-written script by David Magee, who brings more depth to these characters. The cast is just splendid – Halle Bailey, Jonah Hauer-King, Javier Bardem and Melissa McCarthy. There are some scenes that may be a little frightening for the very young, but on the whole, this is a great film for the entire family. There is no dream too big or too small.

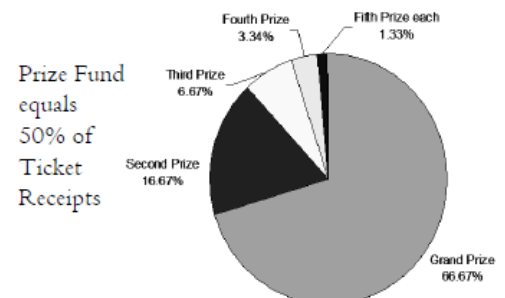

Nurse Ministry

Dear Parishioners of the Parish of Good Shepherd,

Recently we have had the good fortune of having a retired RN register as a parishioner. She has reached out and proposed the following as a way she could give back to you.

Nurse Ministry

Purpose: To provide parishioners with information, assessment, referrals and advocacy in regard to their healthcare needs.

My background: Recently retired RN with 28 years working at St. Francis Hospital/Catholic Health of LI. This included bedside nursing, home care nursing and care management.

What I can provide to the parishioners:

- One home visit (if parishioner allows or requests) to listen to and assess home care needs and concerns.
- Assessment of home of: Patient safety, Need for medical equipment, Medication compliance, MD visit compliance
- Information of: How to obtain medical equipment under insurance, How to obtain home care services if warranted including visiting nurse, physical therapy, home health aide and social worker under Medicare guidelines.
- Education on: Safety precautions, Medication compliance, Nutrition
- Lend an empathetic ear to patient and caregiver concerns.
- Follow up phone call

What I CANNOT do:

Hands on care
