FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of The Good Shepherd,

Last weekend we celebrated Father's Day. I'm sure that many families had beautiful gatherings and tributes for Dad. Yet, these family celebrations seem to be diminishing more and more over the years; everyone it seems is so busy, everyone so focused on tomorrow rather than today. At the same time, consider that before there are families, there is marriage (usually but not always coming first these days). But before any and all of these celebrations of families or marriage, there must be love. And there must be everything which makes 'love' what 'love' is - respect, honesty and a sense of self-sacrifice must be present before anything else. Today, we also need to add equality, perhaps a quality of the relationship that wasn't considered as important in the past. It is in this context of what love – beyond 'romantic love' is – that I harken back to some of the thoughts that Pope Francis shared with us back in 2014, in his address to engaged couples on Valentine's Day (February 14th) of that year.

Pope Francis noted that, "A marriage is not successful just because it endures; quality is important. To stay together and to know HOW to love one another FOREVER is the challenge for Christian couples (emphasis mine). What comes to mind is the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves: for you too (as a couple), the Lord can multiply your love and give it to you fresh and good each day. He has an infinite reserve! He gives you the love that stands at the foundation of your union and each day he renews and strengthens it. And he makes it even greater when the family grows with children."

What a marvelous comparison because Pope Francis who is so grounded in scripture gives us a connection which most people wouldn't come to on their own! We know that Jesus performed this miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish out of love and compassion for the people gathered in that deserted place. And even in the midst of disappointment or annoyance in the engaged or marital relationship, Jesus wants the couple to experience the multiplication of those qualities which brought them together in the first place.

But how does this occur? Pope Francis explains. **"On this journey, prayer is important; it is necessary, always, he for her, she for him and both together."**

I would love to know – through your responses verbal or written – how married couples might pray together. Might you share grace before meals? Might you pray together before bed like Sarah and Tobiah in the Old Testament Book of Tobit. Might you come to Sunday Mass or pray the rosary together? Might you pray with your children before their bedtime? These are moments when the multiplication of love can take place in simple and ordinary but powerful ways. It is in this context of prayer that Pope Francis continues,

"Ask Jesus to multiply your love. In the prayer of the Our Father, we say, 'Give us this day our daily bread'. Spouses can also learn to pray like this, 'Lord, give us this day our daily love', for the daily love of spouses is bread, the true bread for the soul; what sustains them in going forward."

I think it's safe to say that Pope Francis intended this play on the words of the Our Father, not just for the engaged and married couples but for all families. A few simple words can remind us how powerfully God can work in our lives and how powerfully we can prevent disharmony and discord within the family with a few heartfelt words. The more this simple prayer becomes a part of our lives, the more there can be a daily renewal, a daily multiplication of all the gifts, all the virtues, all the unique qualities which bring couples together in the first place. And the sooner this prayer is incorporated into the family life with little children – the more powerful its effect in ordinary daily life. We don't know how that miracle of the loaves and fish happened – but it did – but it's also true for us. We don't know how God helps the love in us to multiply, but God is Love and God can achieve this multiplication of grace if we but ask!

Twelve score and seven years ago “our fathers brought forth, upon this continent, a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal,” as Abraham Lincoln once reminded us. This week we as a nation once again mark that new beginning, we who have inherited its blessings as a gift generously bestowed upon us by those who have gone before us, a gift not deserved but nevertheless ours, a gift we do not own, yet pass on to generations to come, a gift we eagerly share.

Hospitality is something to extend to those who come to our doors; it is also something we can extend to those who come to our shores. It seems worthwhile then, especially this week and amid so many disagreements over immigration, to revisit the words inscribed at the base of the Statue of Liberty written by the poet Emma Lazarus and inscribed in our psyche as a nation. It serves as a vision of who we are, perhaps as much as does our Constitution.

Give me your tired, your poor,
Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore.
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me;
I lift my lamp beside the golden door!

The woman at Shunem offered Elisha the prophet hospitality, and she was blessed. Jesus promised that those who offer the hospitality of a cup of cold water will be blessed. Surely then, any nation that welcomes others in hospitality will be blessed as well. ●
