FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

You've probably heard stories about fortunes won and lost in the old wild west of our country. After the discovery of gold at Sutter's Mill and silver strikes in Nevada and Alaska, thousands made their way out west in the hope of discovering a vein of these precious metals and becoming rich. It took strength, perseverance, and more than a little luck and cunning, to start digging out a mine, in keeping that claim or panning for gold in a river where two dozen others were doing the same thing.

Once there was a miner, who like many, sank the entirety of his savings to travel out west. At first he was very dedicated to following his routine; rising with the sun, spending hours in that same hot blazing sun working his claim and every once in a while plucking out a small nugget which continued to spur on his efforts. Yet after a while, the daily work of digging became harder and harder and even with those rare finds of gold, the effort seems less and less rewarding. So the miner asks a question, "Is it all worth it?" He needs to make a choice: to continue in the hopes of finally striking it rich or to hope that he can persuade someone to buy his stake and recoup some of his expenses.


St. John of the Cross was a Spanish Priest, Mystic and Poet, Doctor of the Church, Friend of St. Theresa of Avila and Saint who died in 1591. He used the idea of digging for gold as an analogy for our spiritual lives. Certainly, the gold for which we're searching is a deep and satisfying relationship with Jesus Christ. In that relationship, we become rich beyond anything this world can offer. Indeed St. Paul also reminds us (2Cor.4:7 and known to us in the song "Earthen Vessels") that each of us in our bodies hold a treasure, not made of gold, but the treasure we hold is the glory of God, Jesus the Lord. This treasure, given to us in baptism, in becoming brothers and sisters of Jesus, is indeed buried deep within our fragile bodies.

To combine the thoughts of St. John and St. Paul, in our prayer lives, you and I are those miners who have been given a stake, a spiritual opportunity to 'strike it rich'. But like digging, we can find praying to be hard, difficult and often unrewarding work. We can send our prayers soaring up to God, but like the miner, that rich vein of ore can be very difficult to find. As we sweat laboring in the hot sun of everyday life, we may be tempted to ask whether it is all worth the effort. Indeed, from time to time, we do find those 'spiritual nuggets of gold' called God's grace and solace which can sustain us for a while. Then after a while we may lose heart and want to quit.

The miner from the narrative above, did lose heart and sold out to another. For a time he was satisfied with the sale and even a little embarrassed that he had sold his 'worthless' claim to an unsuspecting buyer. Yet a short time later, he heard that the person who bought his mine had indeed hit a rich vein of ore and had become very wealthy. It's a story that has been told numerous times in real life. How do you think the miner felt when if he just been a little more persistent, he himself would have found the gold?

This scenario can be all too real in our prayer lives as well. You and I can get distracted, we can get discouraged when it seems that God isn't listening to us. Psalm40:1 reminds us, "I waited and waited for the Lord, now at last he has stooped to me and heard my cry". And if the psalm doesn't inspire, check out Mt.7:7 – "Ask and you shall receive; seek and you shall find...knock and the door will open." During the summer we may become busier than usual, yet we know that we need to continue in our prayerful efforts. Just keep digging, just keep trusting, just keep understanding that prayer – our conscious relationship with God may feel difficult - but in the end bestows a richness beyond telling.

Our lives seem to be plagued by an abundance of words,

all seeking to influence us. Television ads try to convince us to buy; teachers seek to pass on knowledge; parents cajole, discipline, and beg; society warns against drinking and driving, smoking and drugs; preachers hope to convert and change. They all do so with limited and varying success, and at times seeming failure. Too often there is the presumption that more words will achieve greater results.

In the face of such questionable success, the prophet Isaiah proclaims that God's word "shall not return to me empty, / but shall do what pleases me, /achieving the end for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11). Yet the Gospel also suggests that the seed of God's word sown in our lives may wither and be choked off and fail to take root, though also promising that what does produce fruit will surpass anything hoped for.

Because war is news and the media is obliged to report on it, it may appear that war is prominent worldwide. Not so. Statistically there is less war today than ever before, less violence, less conflict. We are more likely to die in our beds than at any other time in history. While there is yet much hunger in the world, there is less than at any other time. Nations are more inclined to try to negotiate peace. Great generosity abounds amid natural disasters, and while injustice prevails, we still fight to overcome it. All of it the fruitfulness of God's word.

Creation is groaning in labor pains, says St. Paul, and we also groan. Yet the groaning attests to the pains of growing fruitfulness.






