FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

At times we may think that God isn't calling us to serve Christ and the Gospel beyond what we already may be doing. Yes, we participate in the Eucharist, most Sundays (or perhaps even less). Yes, we pray; many times asking in our prayers of petition rather than praising or giving thanks to God. How often we speak rather than listen. Do we allow ourselves to be still and feel God's presence in and around us? Yet, is that enough? – especially if we are called to produce a harvest of 30/60/100 fold (last week's gospel). I assure you that Our God is always calling, always prompting, always nudging us to serve the people of God in ways that we might not ever expect.

You may recall a young tennis star named Andrea Jaeger. She was just 14 years of age when she turned professional and rose in the ranking of top players, at one time rated number 2 in the world. As an 18 year old, she gained what many tennis players consider the pinnacle of success – reaching the finals in Wimbledon (she lost). But it wasn't this disappointment, any other loss on the courts or even the shoulder injury which helped her to decide to give up the potential of making millions of more dollars from her tennis talents. She felt God was calling her to do something more than tennis.

Fairly recently, Yaeger opened up and revealed why she suddenly quit the sport in which she excelled and became an Episcopalian nun. In this interview, she spoke about the systemic abuse she suffered, helping her to make the decision to walk away. She said, "My parents didn't go to church. We didn't have a Bible in the house, but for whatever reason, I feel God gave me a gift of faith. I always said my prayers when I was little. No one told me to. I didn't learn in school or from TV. I just knew God existed and that we were friends and had a personal relationship. None of my family knew I prayed every day of my life."

There were many comments, most of them negative, when she walked away from the sport. Some said that she was a victim of her own success; burning out young. She was labeled as a "lost soul". In reality, it was the very opposite. Forty years after she abruptly left the game, Jaeger described the sexual harassment in the locker rooms from a former employee of the Women's Tennis Association among other disturbing hassles, including being a target of practical 'jokes' like having razor blades put inside her shoes.

Therefore, it wasn't a great revelation to her when she felt the call to begin helping kids with cancer, becoming, for the past few decades, director of the "Little Star Foundation". It was there that she placed the millions of dollars won on the tour.

We seldom know ahead of time what God is calling us to do and to be. I know for me personally, as a child, priesthood was far down on the list of things to pursue. At that time, I would have given anything to become an astronaut and later on was quite focused on a military career. But when you fail the eye test, what the tennis phenom and I had in common was hearing that "inner voice"; being open to the grace of God and being pliable to the direction we were being pointed.

I'm hoping that our younger parishioners will read this column and 'be open' to consider that God may be calling them to something beyond their personal dreams. I'm also hoping that parents of our school age children come to realize that they also may be called to a Ministry of Service; perhaps as a catechist, a Eucharistic minister, a lector or member of the choir. Perhaps someone reading this has felt that inner tug to test the vocation as a deacon. Perhaps someone has time on their hands or a special skill and feels a need to share some of that time and talent with the wider community. Like Andrea Yaeger, any of us might be called to take that extra step.

Andrea Yaeger said, "Sometimes I think that God puts me in places for other people's faith to be restored or inspired". I think that's what God desires for all of us – whether we know it or want it or not!

Much like still-fishing, which is when the fish ultimately find the one sitting quietly waiting for the fish, most of the really treasured aspects of life somehow find us when we're not looking. Consider falling in love or discovering a friend; the job you enjoy so much that you'd almost do it for free; a hobby that gives you so much satisfaction; creative gifts you never knew you had until you stumbled upon them later in life. To say nothing of happiness for which so many go looking and never seem to find, while others are happy without ever seeking it out.

Wisdom, the gift Solomon asked for, is much like all of that. It seems to find us. Common sense, the stepchild of wisdom, is something most parents want their children to have, and, for some parents, it may be a source of great frustration as they try to make sure their children have it and use it. Wisdom is certainly a hint of the kingdom of heaven, but then so too is finding love and experiencing joy and living with a peace that refuses to be unsettled by the storms of life. All of those are the buried treasures of which the Gospel speaks, just as for others it is the pearl of great price for which they look and look until it finds them, not unlike still-fishing. 




