FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

In any number of movies, television programs and stories, you would encounter a person of a certain, senior age – retired from earning a living and well past the age of raising children – on a porch, slowly rocking, perhaps smoking a corn cob pipe, observing life from a rocking chair. That person – man or woman – in the rocking chair was presumed to have a certain wisdom, a certain experience of life with clarity of vision so that there was an insight into all the many problems, all the experiences, all the uncertainties that come in any life. And many would stop by to talk for a while and probably to seek some advice, some answers along with a little bit of comfort and assurance. Wedded to the ‘old ways’, from their rocker, they offered a certain stability and prudence you could trust.

Conversely, there are those of that same senior certain age, who have refused to take up the rocking chair and to quietly watch the rest of their lives pass them by. They possess what’s been described as having vim and vinegar, a certain rebelliousness and confidence which comes with surmounting life’s obstacles and not letting anything get in their way of what they want to accomplish. They’ve been called annoying, cantankerous and obnoxious when they don’t fit into the image or picture of how we think they should act – and yet, they’re able to be a secret inspiration to us.

I believe we’ve known people who fall into either category, the wise and steady elder, the hell raising senior and I wonder which of these categories you and I fit into as Catholics and followers of Jesus Christ. No matter what our age spiritually, do we tend to sit in a rocking chair of comfortable faith – and yes – with a certain solidity and wisdom - and watch the changes that are present in the world? Do we have both the energy and the vitality to take all the experiences of life and to use them to plot a new, unexplored course in our spiritual lives? OR is it possible to meld both aspects of our spiritual journey into one of energetic leadership and humble service?

I think, (you can agree or disagree, but tell me why) that many Catholics tend to sit comfortably in their rocking chair of faith and tend to be fairly passive. We come to church and bring those rocking chairs with us. We listen to the scriptures, we listen to the homilies, we listen to the music – but that’s all we do – we listen without acting on what we’ve heard. I wonder if no matter what our biological age may be, we’ve become old spiritually.

St. James in his one and only letter simply writes that faith without actions is dead. “You say you have faith and I have good deeds. I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds.” Faith – the wisdom of the rocking chair - needs to be paired with the deeds of activity. We know that it takes only a little flame to start a big fire and the church is looking for those little flames to set the world on fire with the wonder of what Jesus has given to us in his preaching, in his death, in his resurrection and in the gift of himself in the Eucharist.

In our first reading today from the Book of Kings, in his dream that God will give him whatever he requests, Solomon prays for wisdom. And that wish is granted. Solomon receives a heart wise and understanding and without equal. YET – at the same time it is Solomon who uses this wisdom TO ACT - to build a great temple to the honor and glory of God who gave him this gift. In our journey of faith, each of us, younger and older, needs to remember that **Faith Requires Actions**. Taking a page from the parables of Jesus, it’s not enough to plant the seed and hope that it grows. You have to actively water it, place it in the sun, fertilize it (and some say talk to it!) to have any success in making it grow. May each of us possess both the wisdom and the active strength of Solomon in our relationship with Christ.

Transfiguration of the Lord (A)

In life there are moments that some call **transcendence**, when the divine shines through the human and the veil that seems to cloak another world falls ever so briefly to reveal that there are not two worlds but only one wrapped in mystery. That is what took place on a mountaintop when Peter, James, and John realized that this Jesus with whom they talked and walked and shared meals, this friend, this very ordinary one, was so much more, was extraordinary, was “of God.” While real, it seemed better not to tell anyone about what they had seen.

Are there also moments in our lives when the human glows with the divine, when we come to realize more clearly than ever before that there is another power at play in life than you yourself? Most assuredly. While we are powerless to create such experiences of transcendence, more than 100 years ago the psychologist William James described such moments when they do occur. He identified four qualities in such experiences: 1) they seem closer to being emotional than intellectual or cognitive; 2) they tend to bring us new understandings of life and of what is, akin to insights, though they cannot be found in a book or be taught; 3) they tend to be very brief, a few seconds for most people; and 4) there is a sense of being sustained by a superior power. This was the apostles' experience of the transfiguration, the feast we celebrate today. ●

Today, for various reasons, many people are interested or perplexed about what it is to be a Catholic. The Rite Of Christian Initiation (RCIA) is the process or the JOURNEY OF FAITH by which unbaptized adults are brought into the Catholic Faith OR adults who have never received the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion are fully initiated.



The RCIA Journey of Faith begins on Tuesday September 26th right here at Good Shepherd Church. We meet in the church library between 7 & 8pm for instruction, discussion and guidance. During this hour, by participation in Sunday Mass (we begin attending mass formally as a group on the 1st Sunday of Advent December 3rd and every Sunday thereafter) and other celebrations, individuals will gradually be initiated into the community of the faithful, culminating in the celebration of the Easter Vigil and Pentecost.

Let's get the children more connected to what God has created for everyone to enjoy and appreciate!



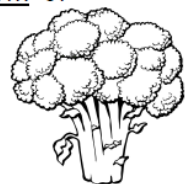
The *Garden Ministry* proudly announces

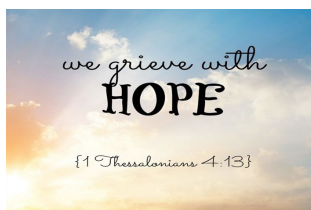

Upcoming Bereavement Support Program Offered at St. Mary, East Islip Eight Week Group beginning Tuesday, September 12, at 7pm

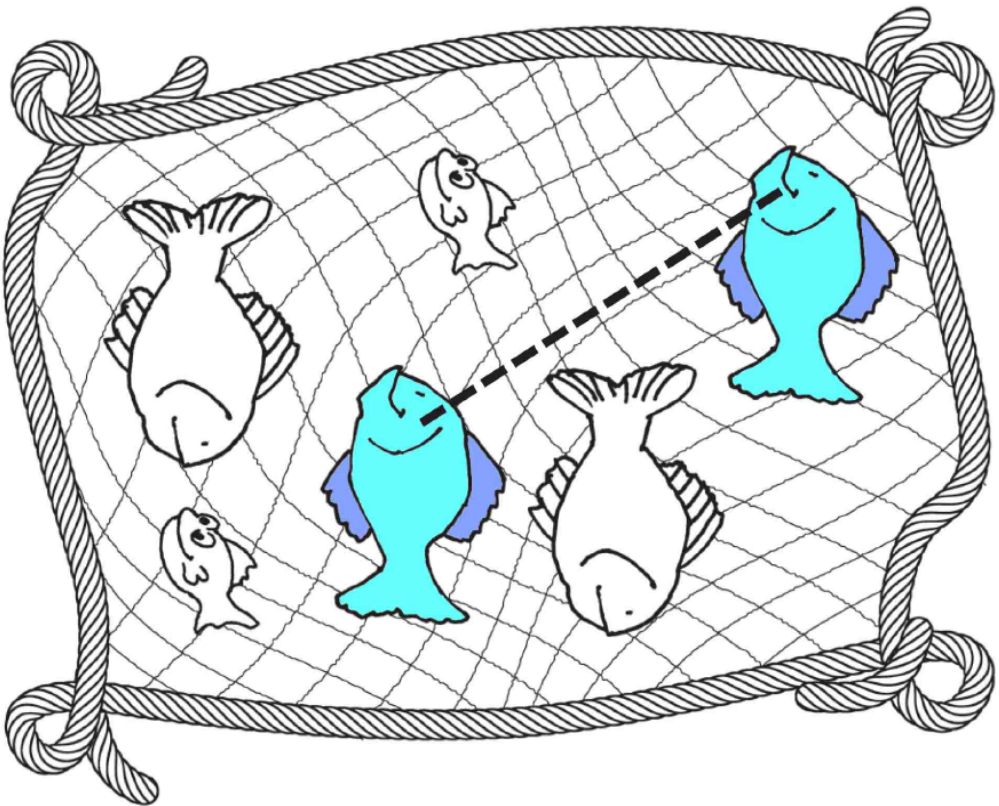

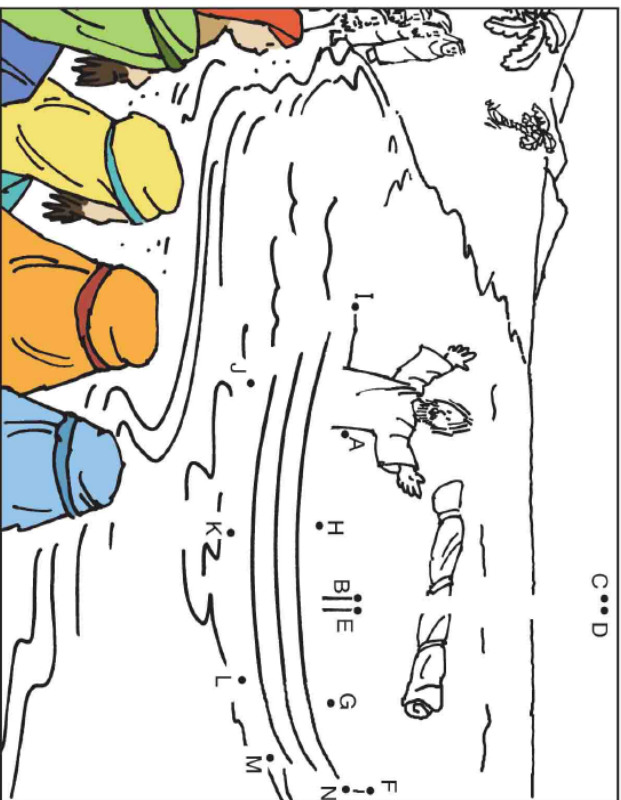

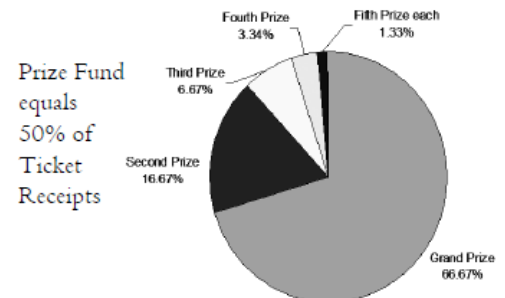
