FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

I'm sure that most of you have heard of the term used in war – “Unconditional Surrender”. This means no negotiations, no bargaining; just an absolute agreement by a country or kingdom to lay down its arms, and basically accept defeat without any further question. Usually, this unconditional surrender is imposed, as it was at the end of World War II, on an enemy utterly destroyed and defeated. The leaders and people who lost place themselves completely at the mercy of their conquerors.

Yet this term of “Unconditional Surrender” can and should be applied to our spiritual lives as well. This unconditional surrender, however, isn't seen in terms of defeat or conquest but in reality, a victory. Paradoxically, it is by completely and totally surrendering ourselves to God that we allow ourselves to be conquered by Christ's love for us. It is in surrendering to him, allowing him to dominate our lives, that in fact we become victors over sin and death.

Because if you stop and think about it, each and every day, we're engaged in a spiritual battle; the battle for our souls between ourselves and the temptations and snares of the devil. You and I know that every person in the world struggles with the desire to do good and the temptation to think of ourselves alone at the expense of everything and everyone else; otherwise known as sin. We've seen the cartoons depicting a little devil on one shoulder and a little angel on the other shoulder whispering into our ears trying to sway us in one direction or the other.

Archbishop William E. Lori, reminds us that on Easter Sunday, we celebrate the main battle between everlasting life and everlasting death, seeing the turning point of this cosmic battle in the resurrection of Jesus from the grave – His victory over sin and death. Our Easter hymns speak of the stupendous battle between good and evil, life and death, both universal and within our persons.

Yet, we need to continually remember that Christ's triumph was not a victory of force, but a victory of love. Remember the gospel story of the rich young man who had many possessions, who wanted to follow Jesus, but could not bring himself to 'surrender' his wealth in order to 'be perfect'. Jesus doesn't negotiate with him; Jesus doesn't beg him to reconsider; Jesus allows him to make his own decision whether or not to accept this unconditional surrender of love within his life.

In reality, this is what the call to discipleship, the call to “come and follow me” is all about. We possess the belief that the Word of God was committed to a total surrender of being in the divine form of God and humbled himself to take on the form of a slave being born as a human being, born in the likeness of you and me. Jesus gave up everything, an unconditional surrender, for the love of the Father and love for us in order to claim us whole and entire, body, soul and spirit for his kingdom.

So how do we participate in Christ's victory? – By totally and completely making an unconditional surrender to him; holding nothing back. We know that all too often you and I bargain with God. We say we will love; we will follow IF so and so or this and that happens - and even then, we fail. This unconditional surrender means admitting that in the battle against sin, that we can't win on our own – we need the ultimate weapon – God's grace – in order to survive, let alone win. This total surrender to God's grace, God's love, means, surrendering our will to God's will. On this Feast of the Transfiguration, St Ignatius of Loyola (feast 31 July) says it best: **“Take, Lord, receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, my entire will; all I have, all I possess – You gave it all to me; Lord, I give it all back to you.”**

1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a / Romans 9:1-5 / Matthew 14:22-33

As priests we’re expected to plan our own funerals, including the Scripture readings. As it happens, I chose the Gospel for this Sunday, the one about Jesus walking across the water and inviting Peter to trust and step out of the boat and come to him. You may think it strange for a funeral, but it’s been pretty much the story of my life.

Often there have been times when I was asked to go where I didn’t want to go, like Peter being asked to get out of the boat. Ultimately I realized that those were also the very times when I seemed most aware of God’s presence. Oh, I think God was always there, it’s simply that my own ego often got in the way. It was when I gave in that I most felt buoyed by God. In fact, the least satisfying assignment was the one I eagerly sought out, and some of those I resisted turned out to be graced. Like Peter, it’s good to do what doesn’t always make sense.

What does all this have to do with my choice of this Scripture reading for my funeral? Well, every time I have stepped out of the boat of security, God has been there to sustain me. I figure there is going to be no bigger “stepping out” than death, so I’m expecting God will be there as well. ●

Today, for various reasons, many people are interested or perplexed about what it is to be a Catholic. The Rite Of Christian Initiation (RCIA) is the process or the JOURNEY OF FAITH by which unbaptized adults are brought into the Catholic Faith OR adults who have never received the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion are fully initiated.

The RCIA Journey of Faith begins on Tuesday September 26th right here at Good Shepherd Church. We meet in the church library between 7 & 8pm for instruction, discussion and guidance. During this hour, by participation in Sunday Mass (we begin attending mass formally as a group on the 1st Sunday of Advent December 3rd and every Sunday thereafter) and other celebrations, individuals will gradually be initiated into the community of the faithful, culminating in the celebration of the Easter Vigil and Pentecost.

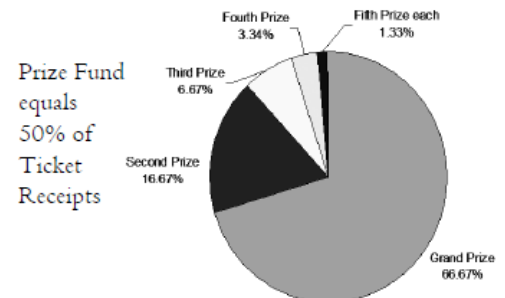

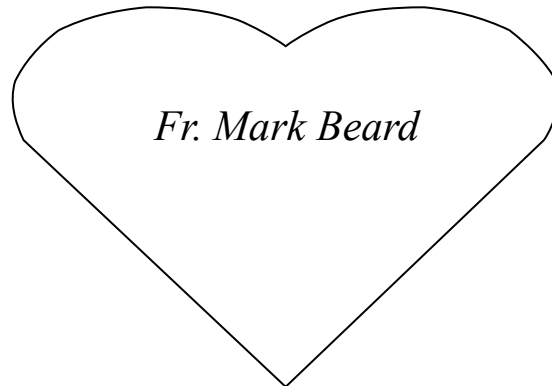
