FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

Do you remember how years ago every child's excuse for not handing into the teacher their homework was that the 'dog ate it'? Well, this column is written on the cuff because the computer ate my column on patience and even with expert help, it seems that all the wisdom I was set to impart has been lost and unlikely to be retrieved.

So, as we come to the end of the summer, I'll take this opportunity to provide the following reminder. It is very important that as we start looking to get back into the usual late August and early September routine of getting ready for school by picking up all the needed supplies and new clothes with all the hopes for a new year of classes and learning, our spiritual lives which might have been neglected a bit over the summer also needs the same kind of attention.

We don't need to buy things in order to attend Sunday Mass, but we do need to remember that whatever liberties we may have taken in being a little lax in our daily prayer and presence here on Sunday, needs to get back into the Autumn routine. I think that both Our Lord and our family of faith may have been feeling a little neglected, especially at the 10am Family Mass. Father Jerry and I found that the sanctuary steps which had been crowded with our younger parishioners during the school year for a homily directed to them became more and more sparse of children as the summer progressed. The priests certainly understand that many families have been lucky enough to take that well deserved 'get away'. But there have been so many people we've missed seeing and greeting and I hope even with the busyness of many summer activities, that you've missed us as well.

While there was a noticeable decline in the numbers of our children (and their parents) over the summer, I do want to acknowledge all those whom we did see all during the summer months. We appreciate your faithfulness and dedication and I hope that we have continued to feed you through the Word of God, our thoughts through our homilies and via the celebration of the sacrament of Holy Eucharist.

Let me also take this opportunity to remind all our Religious Formation Families that **SEPTEMBER 1st IS THE CUT OFF DATE FOR REGISTERING AND ALSO REREGISTERING FOR PARISH FAITH FORMATION CLASSES FOR OUR CHILDREN.** Sister Ellen and her assistant Linda are **EXTREMELY CONCERNED THAT A SIZEABLE NUMBER OF FAMILIES WHO HAVE BEEN PART OF OUR PROGRAM IN THE PAST HAVE NOT YET EXPRESSED THAT THEY WANT TO REREGISTER – ESPECIALLY SINCE THIS HAS BEEN AVAILABLE TO FAMILIES SINCE JUNE.**

We do need to complete class sizes and coordinate with our Catechists so that all our students can be placed. In the past Sister Ellen and Linda have been very frustrated and literally overwhelmed by the number of families who have not contacted their office to re-register.

In all sincerity, I ask you to respect the process because we cannot continue to operate as in past years with families assuming that they would be the only ones to be past the deadline and that there would be no problem in being late. As families have already been informed through various communications – **SEPTEMBER 1st IS THE ABSOLUTE LAST DAY TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES. IF YOU ARE HAVING ANY PROBLEM – FINANCIALLY OR OTHERWISE, PLEASE CONTACT LINDA OR SR. ELLEN – NOW!!!**

Over the years I’ve asked many people what they believe about Jesus and who he is for them. I’ve always nudged them away from the expected answer simply because I was interested in who he was for them down deep in their spirits. It’s been a whole wheelbarrow full of answers, yes it has, a full and varied garden.

Some said they thought he was a very good human being, though they hedged when I asked if they thought he was also of God. Others thought he was a prophet, though they also backed away from anything that hinted of the divine. For some, Jesus was God dressed in human skin, as if he were simply playing at being human. Some labeled him a reformer and others a teacher. None of them dismissed Jesus as irrelevant or a remnant of the past. And for many, Jesus is the truth professed by Peter, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.” He is the Word made flesh, the wisdom of God among us, the one who lives.

In one way or another all of us must answer the question Jesus asks of his disciples in today’s Gospel: “Who do you say that I am?” The question is just as relevant today as it was when Jesus asked it. For some, their yes is without doubt. For others, it is a questioning journey of coming to faith. All of us are faced with that question: Who is Jesus for us today in the way we live our life? ●

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults – A journey in Faith

Are you interested in becoming a Catholic or receiving the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Eucharist? Do you know someone who needs to complete the reception of their sacraments or is feeling spiritually lost?

Today, for various reasons, many people are interested or perplexed about what it is to be a Catholic. The Rite Of Christian Initiation (RCIA) is the process or the JOURNEY OF FAITH by which unbaptized adults are brought into the Catholic Faith OR adults who have never received the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion are fully initiated.

The RCIA Journey of Faith begins on Tuesday September 26th right here at Good Shepherd Church. We meet in the church library between 7 & 8pm for instruction, discussion and guidance. During this hour, by participation in Sunday Mass (we begin attending mass formally as a group on the 1st Sunday of Advent December 3rd and every Sunday thereafter) and other celebrations, individuals will gradually be initiated into the community of the faithful, culminating in the celebration of the Easter Vigil and Pentecost.

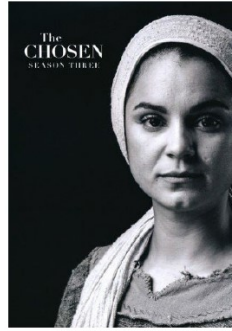

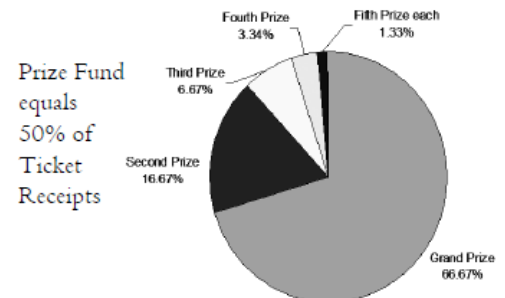
