FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

You never know what may be going through another person's mind. You may never suspect the pain they may be feeling or the intensity of the burden they're carrying. You may never know how angry they are from the expression on their face. You may never know what a simple act of kindness may do to totally change a person's outlook and frame of mind.

Peter was walking home from school one afternoon. But on this particular day, when he got to the corner, he saw a boy his own age kneeling on the ground surrounded by books, gathering papers that the breeze hadn't yet snatched away. Peter ran over and started helping him clean up the mess.

"What happened? Are you new around here? I'm sure I haven't seen you before", Peter said. "I didn't see the uneven sidewalk and tripped with all my stuff. Yeah, we moved in from Texas. Thanks for helping; it's been a rough streak." As the boy spoke, he quickly stuffed something into his pocket.

"Why don't you come to my place", offered Peter. "It's just around the corner and my mom always has a snack ready when I come home. Then we can play some of my video games. What's your name?"

Tom started to make excuses, but Peter was already carrying some of his books and marching to his house. It turned out that as they spent the rest of that afternoon together, they liked the same sports teams and had many of the same interests. It didn't take them many weeks to become best friends. About a year later, Tom asked Peter if they could talk about something serious. Peter saw the pain in his friend's eyes and thought he had done something to offend Tom.

"Remember the day we met?", he rambled on without waiting for an answer. "You helped me gather all the stuff I dropped. I know you saw me jam something into my pocket. It was the extra key to my dad's gun box. Life was really horrible with the divorce, the move and everything. I was going to shoot myself that afternoon until you invited me home and we spent time together. You never guessed back then, but you saved my life that day. Without knowing it, you made me forget about all the difficult things I was going through and made me feel a whole lot better, that someone cared."

The above story is a story, but one which thousands of people can identify with; about the tremendous difference a simple, random, act of kindness can make in a person's life. It is a thought which can make our heads spin, but in a way similar to Jesus, we can make a fantastic difference in anyone's life. If you think about it, we should have an international "Act of Kindness" Day. Can you imagine the unbelievable effect for the good that a few billion acts of kindness would render? I'm brought to these reflections by two inescapable observations.

First, is that the teens of this generation have the highest degree of suicide and self-abuse since records of this thing first were kept. Certainly, there have always been teens experiencing extreme difficulties with their parents, competition with friends, unplanned pregnancies, insecurities of every sort. The boys in the above story were just entering adolescence. Tom thought he had nothing to live for; that his life had gone so far south that it couldn't get better. But it did; a simple act of friendliness made a difference. I wonder how many teens, how many shooters might have had their lives changed by someone who showed they were important. I pray that we may take every opportunity simply to be kind.

Second, is that tomorrow, we once again observe the anniversary of the tragic events of September 11th, 2001. Again, I wonder if anything could have changed them and dissuaded them from these acts of terror. Were any of them like the boy Tom, but never experienced that one act of kindness which might have changed their hearts? After 20 + years, it is difficult to understand the absolute hatred in their hearts which led them to what is undeniably mass murder. After 20 + years. It is even more difficult to forgive them. In these times of such violent extremism, it's more and more important to remind ourselves that our each and every action has an effect for good or ill. In sorrow, let's recall the words of Jesus on the cross, "**Father forgive them for they know not what they do.**"

Terry Anderson was an American reporter in Lebanon when he was abducted by terrorists in 1985. He was held captive by them until his release in 1991. After his release he was asked if he forgave his captors. His response? “I’m a Christian and a Catholic, and it’s really required of me that I forgive, no matter how hard that may be.”

It’s been said that forgiveness is the most difficult thing we have to do, simply because all too often we do not feel like forgiving. Nor is forgiveness about overlooking the injury as if to say, “Oh, that’s OK. Don’t worry about it.” Forgiveness may not even mean being able to be nice. Sometimes the pain may be too much. Forgiveness as Jesus lived it is a choice one makes to care about the other. It is the gift of wanting what is best for the other even at times in the midst of our own pain. “Forgive and forget” is not always possible. At times the pain not only lingers but also throbs as if the wound continues to ooze and weep. Then we cannot forget. Yet it is possible to make the choice to care.

What do we do if we cannot even bring ourselves to do that much? Perhaps then we can at least ask God to bring goodness into that person’s life. And if that seems too difficult, then ask God to do what we cannot. That simple choice may very well be the seed that eventually sprouts into healing and peace in our own spirit. ●

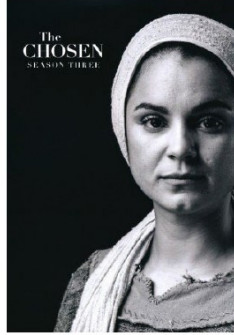
Today, for various reasons, many people are interested or perplexed about what it is to be a Catholic. The Rite Of Christian Initiation (RCIA) is the process or the JOURNEY OF FAITH by which unbaptized adults are brought into the Catholic Faith OR adults who have never received the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion are fully initiated.

The RCIA Journey of Faith begins on Tuesday September 26th right here at Good Shepherd Church. We meet in the church library between 7 & 8pm for instruction, discussion and guidance. During this hour, by participation in Sunday Mass (we begin attending mass formally as a group on the 1st Sunday of Advent December 3rd and every Sunday thereafter) and other celebrations, individuals will gradually be initiated into the community of the faithful, culminating in the celebration of the Easter Vigil and Pentecost.

Pope Francis says: There is room for Everyone”

On August 3, 2023 at World Youth Day, Pope Francis talked to 500,000 young people: He asked all the young people to repeat with me **“Everyone, everyone, everyone – that is the church, the mother of all; there is room for all.”** I invite you to think, this is so beautiful, that God loves us as we are, not how we would like to be or how society wants us to be, **as we are.”**

During that time in a meeting with some priests, one priest, who worked with homosexuals said to the Pope - “ Since they (homosexuals) are virtuous in other areas of their lives, and know the doctrine, can we say that they are all in error, because they do not feel, in conscience, that their relationships are sinful? Should we recognize that their relationships can open up and give seeds of true Christian love?”

Pope Francis replied “I believe there is no discussion about the call being addressed to everyone. Jesus is very clear about this: **everyone.**” The Pope also said “It is clear that today the issue of homosexuality is very strongbut what I don't like at all, in general, is that we look at the so-called “sin of the flesh” with a magnifying glass, just as we have done for so long for the sixth commandment. If you exploited workers, if you lied or cheated, it didn't matter, and instead sins below the waist were relevant.”

Pope Francis also spoke about transgender people. He said a sister, who works with a lot of people who are transgender, asked him if she could bring them to his audience. He said “Sure! Why not?” and so, he said, 'groups of trans (people) come all the time. The first time they came, they were crying. I was asking them why. One of them told me 'I didn't think the Pope would receive me!' After the first surprise they made a habit of coming. Some write to me, and I email them back. **Everyone is invited!** I realized that these people feel rejected, and it is really hard.”

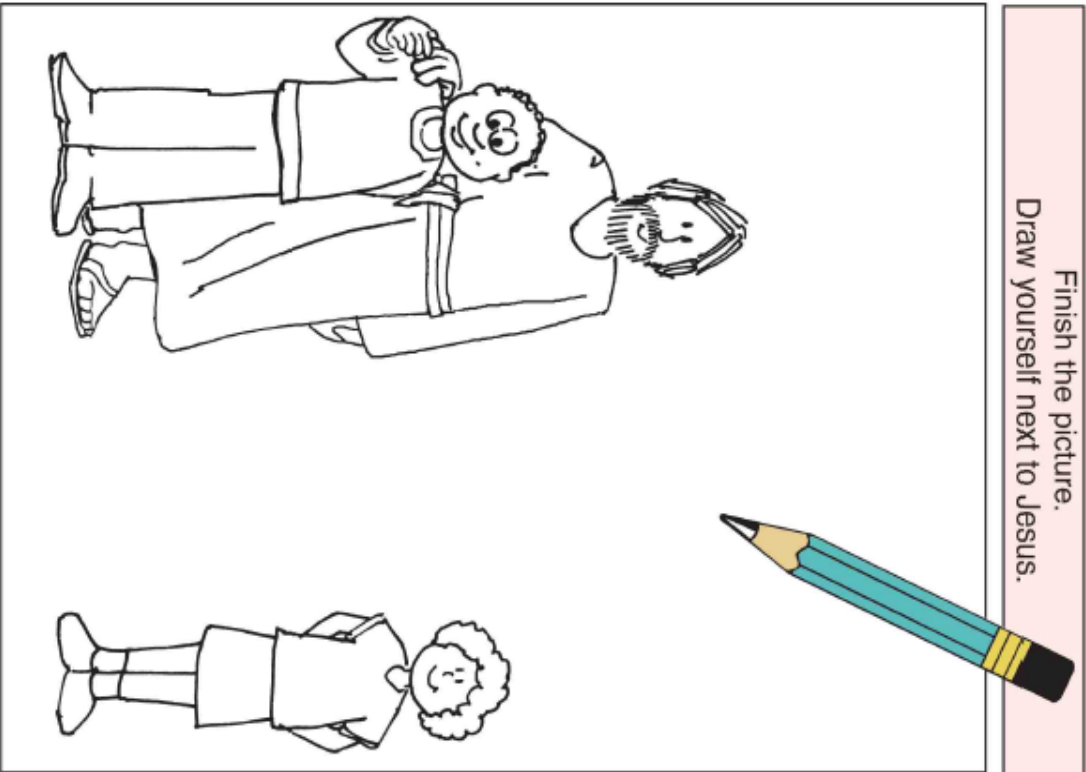

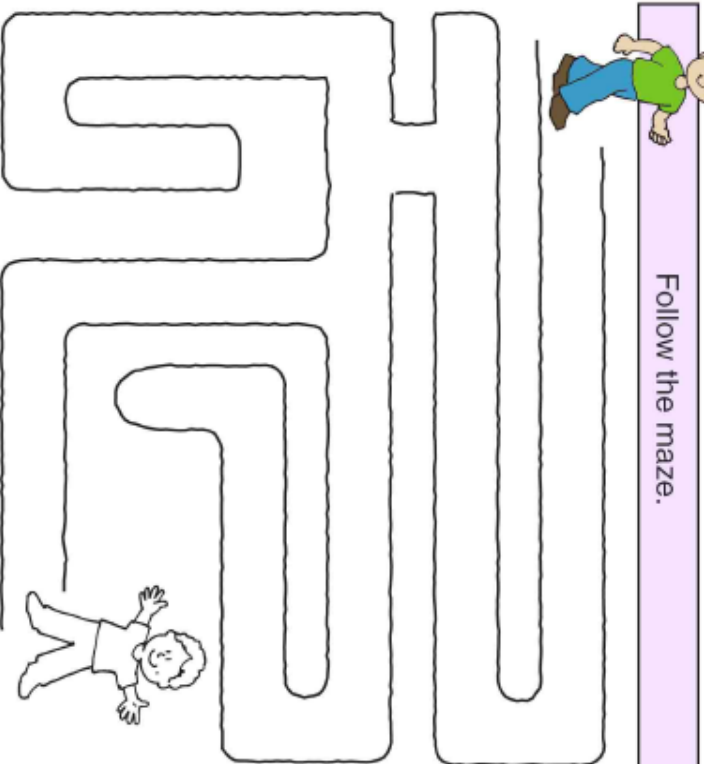

Adoration

Adoration is Back! – Tuesday, September 12, from 12:00 noon to 1:00 pm

Eucharistic Adoration refers to the worship of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. We express our adoration in many ways: genuflecting toward the tabernacle that contains the Blessed Sacrament, kneeling before the tabernacle, and sitting in silent prayer before Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist. The Church encourages us to make frequent visits to adore the Blessed Sacrament kept in the tabernacle.³³

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is a more focused form of Eucharistic Adoration that is part of the Church's liturgical life. It is a solemn rite in which the sacred Host is displayed for public worship. This can take place in a simple way by opening the tabernacle doors or in its fullest form when the consecrated Host is placed in a sacred vessel called a monstrance (based on the Latin word monstrare, which means "to show"), so that it can be easily seen and adored.

All are invited to stop in and spend some time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Jesus is waiting for you to spend some time with Him and share your joy, calm your fear, and rest your soul in answered prayer. Better still... bring a friend!
