FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

In its history, the Catholic Church has always known the joy of expansion; bringing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to every corner of the earth. Except for the period known as the “Protestant Reformation”, when various individuals formed communities which broke away from Rome, and divisions separated the Catholic Church from other Christian denominations, missionary priests and sisters have been sent from their homeland to present the Good News of the Gospel in foreign countries. Our own United States of America benefited from such an infusion of immigrants and religious orders of priests and nuns.

Today, as you probably know, membership in the Catholic church is contracting. The 2008 Pew Research study has shown that *one in ten adults in the United States is a former catholic*. Some have moved on to other Christian denominations, some have no church affiliation at all, and others have formed their own communities of prayer.

This column cannot go into all the reasons this process is happening (yet I’m open to discussion), but rather this is a continuing alarm being raised to remind you that this skid is steeper than you might imagine. CARA, the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (affiliated with Georgetown University), has undertaken the ongoing mission of publishing statistics on major trends in the Catholic world.

Consider the following. In 1965, the high point in the number of Catholic clergy in the United States, was measured at 59,426 priests (both diocesan and religious orders). That number dropped to a staggering 34,344 in 2022. In 1965, those priests *active in ministry* was 95%. Today, priests *active in ministry* is down to 66%. The others, *not active*, are mostly retired or too ill to serve. That means that today, only 15,912 priests are actively engaged in serving the Catholics of this country – and each year the number is going down. The percentages among religious sisters and brothers are even more staggering. Religious sisters in 1965 – 178,740; in 2022 – 36,321. Religious Brothers in 1965 – 12,096; in 2022 – 3,516. We have a perfect example of this trend right here on Long Island. This year, the Diocese of Rockville Centre ordained just one priest, our own Father Steven McClernon. I can think the names of almost a dozen priests who have passed away or retired in the past year. 12 to 1 are not very good odds for continuing service to the Catholics of our diocese. Imagine the dire distress our church would be in without the large numbers of international priests who have come here to augment our numbers and to help minister to you.

All around the world life is changing and not necessarily for the better. What these numbers mean for us as Catholics on Long Island is already being experienced by Catholic parishes around the country. There are areas in upstate New York where ‘priestless’ parishes are the norm with a priest traveling a circuit care for three or four Catholic communities. It is the same throughout the Midwest and South. What they have experienced as the norm for a number of years, we will soon be forced to acknowledge right here – and it won’t be pretty.

We know that vocations to the priesthood are formed in families who are active in practicing their faith – weekly Sunday Mass, frequent celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, family prayer. On Tuesday October 24th, parishes around the Diocese will be praying specifically for vocations to the priesthood. Our parish of the Good Shepherd will also participate in a time of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament – at our usual time from noon to 1pm.

The average age for priests in our diocese is somewhere in the middle 60’s. I myself will turn 68 later this month and assuming good health, I will continue to serve at least until age 75. Yet even if I am able to go beyond the usual retirement age, there are very few in the seminary being trained to step in. Please make that extra effort to be present on October 24th to pray that some ‘miracle of desire’ may occur in the hearts of those Jesus is always calling to serve his people.

Confronted by a social obligation I would prefer to avoid, I frequently find myself musing that the timing is right for me to break a leg or get the flu. Yet more often than not, once I go, I find myself enjoying the gathering. Not all invitations are exciting or even desirable, but many become the building blocks of our lives.

When the parable of Jesus tells of an invitation to come to a wedding feast, it's really a story of our invitation to the kingdom of heaven, where, if we accept, we will dwell in the divine presence and enjoy the peace, joy, and love of God. Heaven is not only *where* we are but also *how* we are. It's an invitation to deeper and richer life—a taste of heaven, even in this life.

So it's good to consider going where we'd rather not go. It's not simply about social gatherings, though a social gathering may be the event where you meet the person you fall in love with. It also may mean going for counseling when that may be a bit scary, or confronting one's addiction, or moving to a new city, or accepting serious and lifelong illness, or saying yes to having a child with special needs, or not getting the job you hoped for. Saying yes to what life brings may be the wedding garment that enriches our lives. It may be saying yes to God. ●

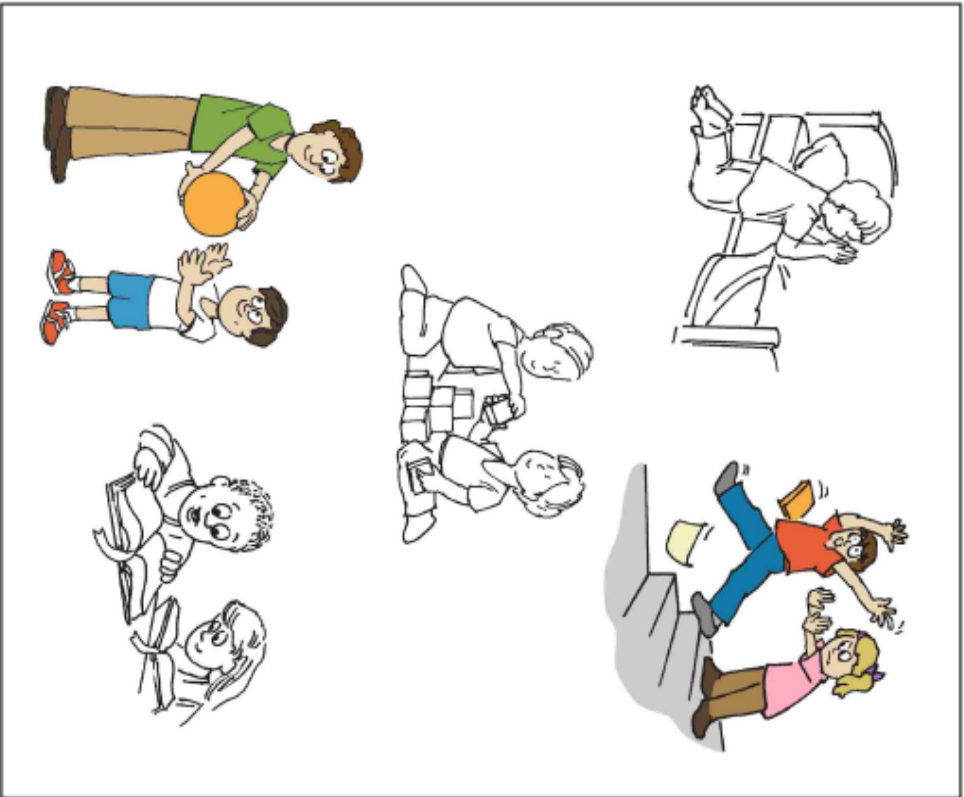

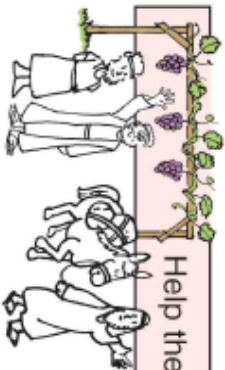

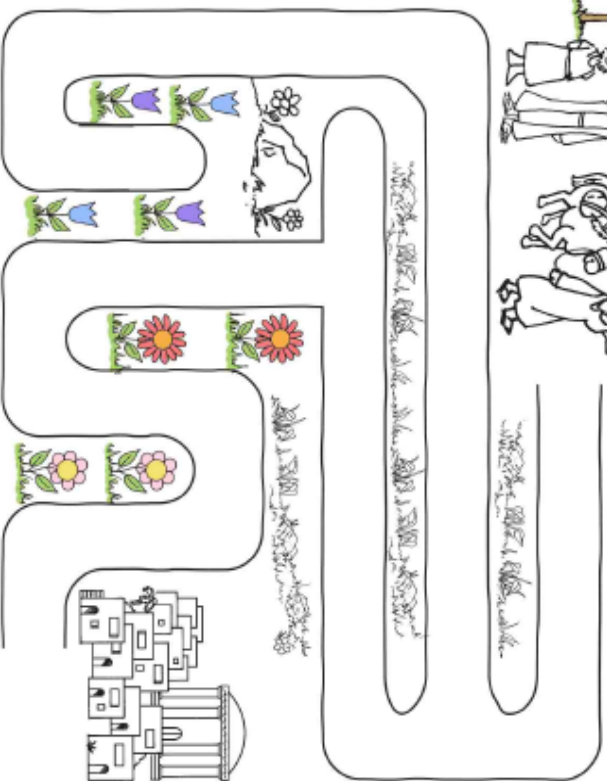

Synod called by Pope Francis opened October 4, 2023 in Rome - Important time for all Catholics

From October 4 to 29, nearly 400 synod participants, with the United States being one of the largest contingents, will gather in Rome for a meeting. This meeting will consider many sensitive issues in church life – the role of women, LGBTQ Catholics, clergy sex abuse and more. For the first time in history, the synod of Bishops will include lay men and women as full voting members.

Pope Francis said that “during the meeting delegates would speak “freely” for several minutes, followed by a pause for reflection, followed by prayer. Without this prayer, it's politics. Don't forget the protagonist is the **Holy Spirit.**”

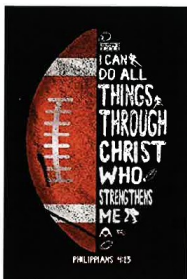
