FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

As you may know the month of October (as is the month of May) is dedicated to Our Blessed Mother Mary. During these two months we're encouraged to be a little more conscious (and frequent) in our devotions to Mary – especially in praying the rosary. Pope Pius V (his feast day is 30 April) dedicated the month of October to Our Blessed Mother in thanksgiving for the naval victory over Turkish forces at Lepanto on 7 October 1571 with the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

I believe this would also be a very good and important opportunity to teach the rosary prayers to our children and grandchildren as a devotional, scriptural, and doctrinal lesson.

The Five Joyful Mysteries of the rosary are prayed on Mondays and Saturdays.

The First Joyful Mystery – The Annunciation (The angel Gabriel announces to Mary that she will be the Mother of God),

The Second Glorious Mystery - The Visitation (Mary's journey to visit Elizabeth her kinswoman), The Third Joyful Mystery – The Nativity (The birth of Jesus),

The Fourth Joyful Mystery – The Presentation in the Temple (Jesus is brought and presented by Mary and Joseph in the Temple 40 days after his birth, in accord with Jewish Law),

The Fifth Joyful Mystery – The Finding of the child Jesus in the Temple (after their visit as a family to Jerusalem, Jesus remains behind and Mary and Joseph find him debating with the scholars of the Law in the Temple).

The Five Sorrowful Mysteries of the rosary are prayed on Tuesdays and Fridays.

The First Sorrowful Mystery – The Agony of Jesus in the garden of Gethsemane (Jesus prays asking the Father whether the cup of his suffering can be avoided),

The Second Sorrowful Mystery - The scourging of Jesus at the Pillar (after his arrest Jesus is whipped),

The Third Sorrowful Mystery - The crowning with thorns (Jesus is mocked with a crown of thorns),

The Fourth Sorrowful Mystery - Jesus carries his cross (the 14 stations of the cross),

The Fifth Sorrowful Mystery - The crucifixion (the manner of Jesus' death).

The Five Glorious Mysteries of the rosary are prayed on Wednesdays and Sundays.

The First Glorious Mystery - The Resurrection from the dead (Easter),

The Second Glorious Mystery - The Ascension (40 days after Easter Jesus ascends into heaven), The Third Glorious Mystery - The Descent of the Holy Spirit (50 days after Easter the Solemnity of Pentecost),

The Fourth Glorious Mystery - The Assumption of Mary (Our Blessed Mother is assumed or taken body and soul into heaven),

The Fifth Glorious Mystery - The crowning of Mary as Queen of Heaven.

The Five Luminous Mysteries of the rosary as instituted by Pope John Paul II are prayed on Thursdays. The First Luminous Mystery - The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordon River,

The Second Luminous Mystery - The Wedding Feast at Cana,


The Third Luminous Mystery - The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God,

The Fourth Luminous Mystery - The Transfiguration

The Fifth Luminous Mystery - The Institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper.

Even if you find that you can't complete one of the Rosary Mysteries, it never hurts to pray even one decade (an Our Father, 10 Hail Marys and Glory Be) for a special intention or specific person.

Good News!

October 16, 2022 Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) Ex 17:8-13; 2 Tm 3:14–4:2; Lk 18:1-8

We ask something of God because we recognize that we are needy and unable to meet the need for which we plead. This itself is a good prayer because it acknowledges our human limitation, an acknowledgement that might be very difficult for us to voice. Such prayer is also an admission of our dependence on God and our trust in God's loving care. A prayer of petition can be profound. However, what is one to do when the request is not realized? Do you ask again? And if so, how many times? If it is never realized, do you stop asking? This is precisely the issue in today's readings.

Moses held his hands up in prayer, and he grew tired. His prayer addressed a community need—victory over the Amalekites—and so two leaders of the community assisted him so that the plea for help could continue until victory was won. The Gospel passage tells a story about a woman whose need of justice made her bold. As a widow in a patriarchal society, she had no husband to speak on her behalf. She had to plead her own case again and again until a just decision was delivered. The moral of these stories is clear: Keep at it!

What happens when our prayer does not seem to be answered? It is still a good prayer, acknowledging our fundamental need and God's loving care of us. The moral of our story is the same: Trust and keep at it!







If crocheting or knitting is not your thing, just come and socialize with us; we would love to have the chance to meet you.

Peanut Butter & Jelly Gang

We are coming back!

The **Peanut Butter & Jelly Gang** whose mission is to serve those in need and provide an opportunity for others to serve will begin meeting in January. Due to the pandemic, the design of our ministry needed to change. During our time away, we provided jars of peanut butter and jelly to our own food pantry here at Good Shepherd. In addition, other food pantries located in Bellport and Mastic Beach were given peanut butter and jelly too. Our wash-up kit supplies were delivered to the Suffolk County Police Department's 6th Precinct and distributed to families in the Bronx who suffered from an apartment building fire. The wash-up kit supplies were given to the John S. Hobart Elementary School in Shirley, NY and were put together by the members of the student council. From there, they were distributed to families in need. Our wash-up kit supplies even traveled to the people of Ukraine.

As you can see, the Peanut Butter & Jelly Gang did continue to do good and follow its mission of serving those in need.

We are planning to meet 4 times starting in January of 2023. Our dates are as follows- 1/7, 2/11, 3/11, 6/10 and WE NEED YOUR HELP.

We need jars of <u>creamy</u> peanut butter and jars of jelly. We need <u>sample</u> size soap, shampoo and wash cloths for our wash-up kits. These items can be dropped off in the lobby of the church; please label them- "For PB&J Gang."

If you are able to, when you come to volunteer, please bring any of the above mentioned supplies and/or 1 loaf of white or whole wheat bread.

We meet from 8:30-9:30 and if needed, 1 hour of community service will be given to those who attend.

Our sandwiches and wash-up kits will be brought to Lighthouse Mission located at 1543 Montauk Hwy, Bellport, NY 11713.
