FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

We all know (I hope) that in 1492, Columbus sailed the ocean blue and ended up in what we have called the New World. In recent years, we've come to learn that good old Christopher Columbus wasn't the first from Europe to land and explore in the Northern Hemisphere – but he is credited with being first to make his discovery known to the people of Spain and the rest of Europe upon his return. It was a discovery to show can you sail west in order to arrive at a place east of that starting point.


Columbus must have at least privately put his trust in his heavenly patron – St. Christopher – the Patron Saint of travelers – going through much tribulation and trials as the voyage yielded no results for so long. In reality, Columbus, probably didn't know exactly where he was going. He has sailing west (into the sunset) in order to arrive in Japan, China and India – hence, at least according to popular convention – how residents on the islands where he landed, came to be called "Indians – American Indians". I think that despite his firm convictions which were indeed born out – Columbus was lucky.

Over the years, I've discovered (not America) but that in my spiritual journey, that like Christopher Columbus, at times, I'm not really sure where I'm headed. Certainly, I'm headed in the right direction and I have a firm and steadfast desire to reach that New World which we call Heaven, the Promised Land, the Kingdom of God - but as I sail along in my daily prayers and devotions and actions, I'm hoping against hope that I'm not too much off course. We know that Columbus used the sun as his guide to keep him on a firm line heading west. You and I have the Son of God to keep us on a firm line heading heavenward - but both Columbus and all of us need to be – must be – persons of faith and hope when it comes to arriving at our final destination. Yet unlike Columbus, none of us should depend on luck. Rather, we do have a guarantee – Jesus Himself.

So, do you sometimes, perhaps most times feel that in your spiritual journey you're just drifting along? Yes, you also know that you want to get to heaven but do you feel that you have little control over the waves of the sea and the winds, those personal temptations which might blow you off course? Do you feel that you also are sailing in the right general direction, but you don't know exactly where you are and how far you still need to go? Are you and I perhaps a little afraid and timid about sailing out of sight of land – the familiar and safe havens of life - knowing that we can always return if the spiritual waves become a little too scary? Are we afraid of taking what is called 'the giant leap of faith' in practicing our faith as Columbus did in making his voyage? Are we just floating on the waters of hope, allowing the wind and tides to move us along rather than actively paddling toward the Light of the Eternal World?

There are times when we need to bold and trusting in our prayer and our faith journey, like Columbus. There are those times when we need to pause and listen to where God is directing us – yet more the former than the later. I can't help but think as I write of Jesus asleep in the boat while the apostles are battling the storm at sea and becoming more and more frightened of drowning. We can have that same experience in the storms of our lives, but we have to be bold and always trusting, "Why are you afraid? It is I". Men – if you have answered 'yes' to any of the questions above, I invite you to join me and others in the voyage of prayer the afternoon of 24 October – see bulletin for details.

Good News!

October 17, 2021

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time (B) Is 53:10-11; Heb 4:14-16; Mk 10:35-45 or 10:42-45

Can You Drink the Cup? That is the question in today's Gospel that Jesus posed after James and John, two of his closest followers, asked for places of honor. They wanted to be recognized for their loyalty. Don't we all? Jesus asks them: "Can you drink the cup?" (Mark 10:38). Can you pay the price? And they both say: "We can" (10:39). Such confidence and self-assurance!

This is a Sunday that focuses on hardship—not the hardship that comes from the burdens of life itself, such as economic distress, racial and gender bias, or the loss of loved ones. Jesus was certainly concerned about these. However, today's readings have a specific focus. He asks: "Can you drink the cup that I drink?" Can you face and endure what I must? Can you follow me to suffering?

Isaiah refers to the servant of the Lord, that mysterious individual who suffers at the hands of others precisely because of his loyalty. However, his suffering is not in vain: "Because of his anguish...my servant, the just one, shall justify the many" (53:11). The spirit of this servant lives on in many stories about Jesus. It certainly does this Sunday. Like the servant, Jesus will suffer for the sake of others. How ready are James and John, you and I, for such a role?

Jesus then turns the values of society upside down. You want to be great? Then you have to serve others. You want to be first? Then, for the sake of others, you have to put yourself last. To follow Jesus means to follow him even through suffering. "Can you drink the cup?"
