FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Parish of the Good Shepherd,

On this great feast of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, I offer to you my heartfelt prayers and sincere thanks for your presence and support of our parish. May the great king of our hearts and souls bless you and walk with you as we enter the Advent Season. I think we've come to realize that as Jesus walked the earth, he also depended on his friends, companions, and various other people who respected him and his teaching so that he could travel to the various towns and villages with his apostles preaching the Good News of the Kingdom of God. Though they may not have walked beside him, they provided money, food and shelter for him and his disciples; they were a support behind the scenes that we rarely think about.

Today, you are that support that I constantly think about and pray for. This week we print in the bulletin (page 6) and on our website for your convenience our Annual Financial Report. Just as Jesus depended on the support of his friends, Fr. Jerry, Fr. Rudy and I depend on all of you. Our church has been facing difficult times over the past 10 years or so. The decline in church attendance started well before the Covid-19 virus hit and the pandemic shut down practically the entire world. Yet while we are slowly building up our weekly attendance, we are still far below where we should be. Too many activities compete for the attention of our people and so, I thank you and congratulate all of you who are consistent in the practice of attending Sunday Mass for both your physical and financial support. I invite you to look at the basic numbers which comprise both our profit and loss, our income and expenses, for the fiscal year beginning on 1 September 2022 and ending on 31 August 2023.

In short, financially, we had a good year – total gross income did rise, but like all of you who know the pain of inflation in your own home life over the past year, so did our expenses painfully grow. The bottom line is that we, thankfully, are in the black for the past year. The reality is that there is only a small 3.5% difference between income and expenses. One unexpected bill – like a major elevator repair – pray to God and the elevator repair company that our elevator only needs minor attention - would be very damaging. So, again, many thanks for bringing a sense of financial stability to our parish life.

As I write, however, the sword pointed at our heart and the heart of the diocese and every parish in that there is no final settlement in the status of the sexual abuse cases against the diocese and the lawyers for the plaintiffs are pressing for money that is not there. As you have probably heard or read, the diocese made a final offer at the end of October to settle all cases for approximately \$200 million – largest pay out of any settlement in the country. So far it has been rejected but negotiations do continue. Please pray to St. Jude – Patron of impossible cases – that there will be a just resolution for all parties in short order.

Just as important as the financial stability of our parish, the spiritual health of the parish is good. Although we do not see any large increases in the number of weddings, baptisms and funerals, there is a notable increase in the numbers of families attending the 10am family mass and the 5pm Sunday Liturgy from the summer months. In recent days we've put two very important events on our Advent calendar which I know will be very profitable for you spiritually. First, on Wednesday December 6th, Bishop Andrzej has accepted my invitation to preside and preach during adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. If you do only one thing this Advent to prepare for the celebration of Christmas, try to be present for this special event. Our Theme is "Come, let us adore him". Second, on the evening of Thursday, December 14th at 6:45pm for the first time, we will be sponsoring a parish sing-along of Christmas Carols in the church. We can hone our voices to celebrate Christ's birth by refamiliarizing ourselves with some of the traditional hymns with a secular song or two for the kids tossed in. The Knights of Columbus will be serving hot chocolate and candy canes in the Parish Hall at the conclusion of our singing. Kids from 2 to 102 are especially welcome.

Sometimes it seems as if life is a laboratory of designed experiments on how to become human, all of them allotted ten-year blocks.

Have you noticed how nine- and ten-year-olds can be easy to be around? Then about the time we've gotten being a kid down to a science, life begins to move us into adolescence. We want to be independent and responsible, but we don't yet have all the skills. We have sexual feelings, but we're expected not to act on them. About the time we reach adulthood and move into our twenties, it seems we can finally do what we want, but then we might drink too much, spend too much, drive too fast, and party too long. Once we begin to settle down around year thirty, we have to learn how to live with another person. One likes it warm, the other cool. One seeks to save, the other spends. One is a homebody, the other enjoys going out on the town. By the time we've gotten to our sixties and seventies, we may have figured out life, but by then we've used up most of our energy.

What's going on?

Faith suggests it's the hand of God shaping us into the sort of persons we're meant to be. "Lord, you are our father; we are the clay and you our potter: we are all the work of your hand" (Isaiah 64:7). Advent may be a time to figure out how God is acting in your life now and look back to see that God was shaping you all along. ●

Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: www.Virtus.org

When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.

- a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first time registrant.
- b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select **Rockville Centre-Safe Environment**.
- c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
- d. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
- e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
- f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.

2. Background Screening Application:

- a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
- b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. **DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION!** If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
- c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
- d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

- Registered to attend a Virtus class ~ signed the Codes of Conduct ~
- Completed the Background Screening.

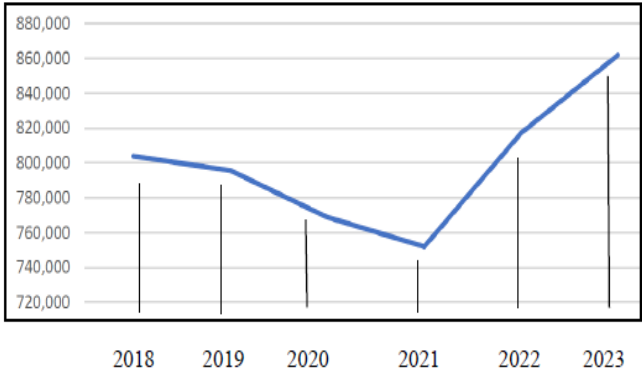

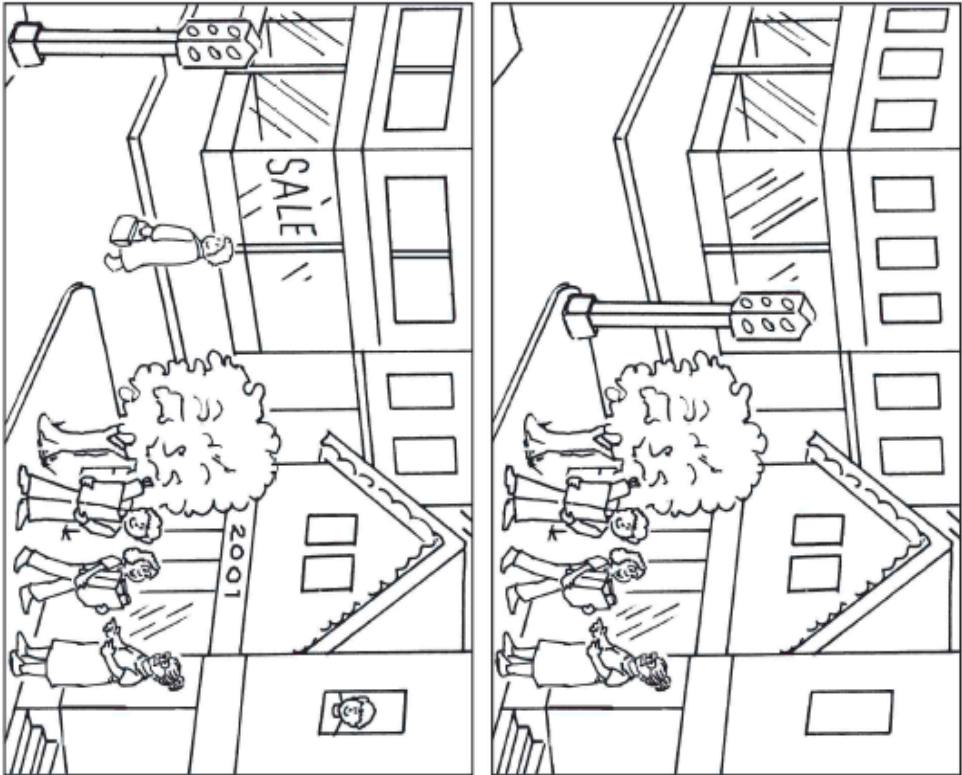

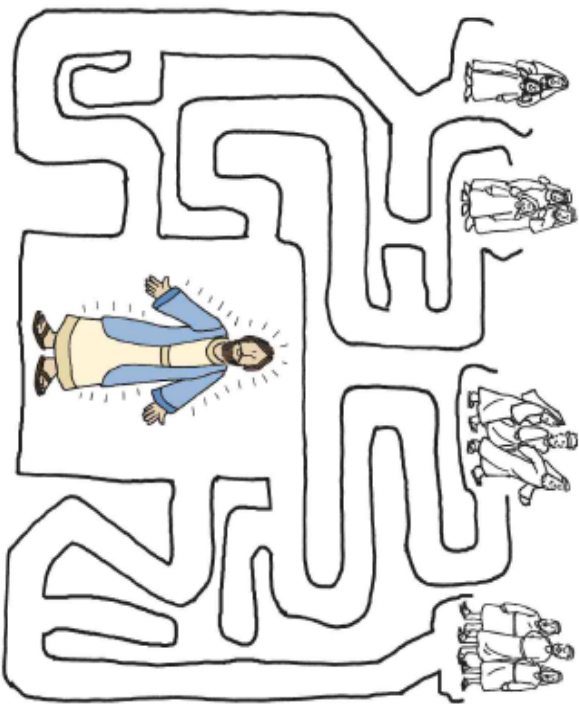
