FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the Parish of The Good Shepherd,

There are three words that we all need to hear on a regular basis – "I LOVE YOU". There are four words, when we truly understand them, which can transform our lives. We've heard these four words more times than we can remember and they may be the ultimate way of hearing God say to us "I LOVE YOU". Jesus, the Son of God tells us how much he loves us each time we hear these four words, "THIS IS MY BODY". Our Lord Jesus Christ is saying, "Here I am, my friend, my child, my brother, my sister. Here I am as the ultimate gift, the ultimate sacrifice, the ultimate life-giving food, the ultimate nourishment, the ultimate act of love. There is no way on this earth today or tomorrow (until I return) that shows my love for each of you individually and communally than when I declare to you through the priest presiding at the Eucharistic Liturgy, "THIS IS MY BODY. THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD". In a way that you can see, I'm shouting, "HERE I AM! HERE I AM FOR YOU".

We've sung the song "Here I Am Lord", many times and we're well acquainted with the question asked before the refrain, "Whom Shall I Send? – Here I Am, Lord. Is It I Lord?" Before time began, Jesus sang to His Father, "Here I AM, send me." As we celebrate our Eucharist, as we come before Him in adoration, Jesus is singing to you and me, "I have heard you calling in the night". I know of your fears. I know your loneliness. I know of the darkness of disease and war which surrounds you. I know of ALL your needs and I hold you in my heart- HERE I AM IN THE HOLY EUCHARIST. SO COME TO ME; speak to me; adore me as the Lord of sea and sky, the wounded one who constantly hears his people cry and feels their pain.

The bishops' call to a Eucharistic Renewal and Revival has its source in the 2019 Pew Forum of Catholics (of all ages) in regard to their belief in the Eucharist. For some reason, far beyond any understanding, despite the unambiguous teaching from the Second Vatican Council that the Eucharist is the **"source and summit of the Christian life"**, CATHOLICS DO NOT UNDERSTAND this central mystery of our faith. If we do not understand the incredible wonder of Jesus' REAL PRESENCE in the Eucharist, how can we hold it dear?

There are moments when I distribute Holy Communion when I wonder when presenting the host that instead of saying "The Body of Christ", we instead should say, "Receive Jesus". Or perhaps as the host is presented to each person, the minister should say "This is Jesus" as we emphasize that each person truly know that their "Amen" is proclaiming, "This is indeed JESUS CHRIST coming to ME".

It is indeed so beautiful and humbling that our children should readily accept that the Bread (the host) becomes the Body of Christ and the Wine now is His Blood. They have amazing questions about HOW this is possible, but they believe. It's ironic that these little children believe and have a greater faith and trust in this miracle more than their parents do. Yes, the Kingdom of God belongs to these innocents.

Because every time Mass – the Eucharist – is celebrated, a tremendous miracle occurs. Through the priest calling down the power of the Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine are sanctified, Jesus Christ IS REALLY AND TRULY PRESENT. And Jesus remains REALLY AND TRULY PRESENT AS THE BLESSED SACRAMENT IN THE TABERNACLE AT ALL TIMES.

I strongly urge you to BE PRESENT TO HIM in our church at 7pm on WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 6TH for a very special night of adoration of Jesus Christ. I assure you, you will be inspired by the thoughts and reflections of Bishop Andrzej. Our theme is **"Come, Let Us Adore Him".** If you do only one thing as your Advent Preparation to celebrate Jesus' birth among us, be here that evening and Come, Adore Jesus that evening as you would bow before him on Christmas Day. Jesus is here for you – be here for him!

Good News!

December 10, 2023 Second Sunday of Advent (B) Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 / 2 Peter 3:8-14 / Mark 1:1-8

In 1992, *Forbes* magazine published an issue titled "Why Do We Feel So Bad When We Have It So Good?" It featured articles by such luminaries as newsman Dan Rather, President George H. W. Bush, and author John Updike. Many of the writers reflected upon our passion for more and our hunger to live in affluence and how that fails to satisfy. In so many ways, we as a nation find ourselves seeking distractions from living with ourselves lest we be confronted by our ultimate loneliness. As a nation we are addicted to entertainment and smartphones, to drugs and pornography, to finding something new. We are confronted by rising suicide rates and a pervasive, deep-seated anger. Why are we not satisfied?

John the Baptist called the people of his day to repent, which is another way of asking them—and us to look at life differently. Advent is really about getting in touch with our deep longing for more, a part of our human condition that ultimately is only satisfied by God. We have been created to long for more, a longing that feels like loneliness, a longing that seeks to be satisfied. In the end, we can only find a sense of peace in the midst of such longing by accepting that it can never be fully satisfied in this life. Like the spirituality of Alcoholics Anonymous, accepting rather than fleeing from our human reality becomes a path to new life. \bullet






