FATHER KEN'S CORNER



Dear Brothers and Sisters of the parish of the Good Shepherd,

"Peace on Earth, Good Will to All!" It may be the language of the angels on Christmas, yet no matter what language we use, somehow it's gotten lost in translation. The war between the Russian invaders and the Ukrainian defenders goes on. The War between Israel and Hamas continues after a very brief cessation of hostilities for the exchange of prisoners. North Korea continues to be bellicose, issuing all sorts of threats against the U.S. and China hasn't softened its hostile activities on the South China Sea.


In our own country and around the world, antisemitism continues now coupled with acts of violence against people of Palestinian origin and Muslims in general. It doesn't take a detective to trace stories almost every day of other acts of violence against members of LGBQT+ community. Violence against members of Asian communities goes unchecked. Road rage in one form or another seems to be all the rage as drivers point guns, beat up and do worse to other drivers who have ticked them off. Peace on earth? Good will toward all? Everywhere we look, there is no peace. There is little or no good will, so why do we continue in our celebrations of the birth of the Prince of Peace?

It is reasonable to posit that each generation faces its own unique problems. Four or five thousand years ago and today, the challenges of life may have been very different, but they still needed to be overcome. Two thousand years ago it might have been a little better (amazing but probably true) for Mary and Joseph as they made their journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem, but they still had to make the journey. It is more than possible that they wondered about how Roman soldiers would treat this carpenter and his pregnant wife when they arrived. They may have worried about being accosted along the way by thieves or robbers, but as they were poor, there were fatter targets on the road than themselves also going to be registered for the census. Mary and Joseph merely looked to have enough to eat on the journey and perhaps wondered with all the people traveling whether there'd be enough room for them at the inn – and we know the answer to that question.

Both Mary and Joseph had unique experiences which strengthened them in facing the unknowns of their journey. It was a journey of faith, yet a journey with no guarantees, despite the knowledge that they both were told, "Do not be afraid." It is with that message that you and I continue our Advent journey. Each of us has had a unique experience of God's presence in our lives (though admittedly not as powerful as Mary's encounter with the Angel Gabriel and Joseph's powerful dream), which has brought us to this moment in the life of faith. Nonetheless, that internal and personal experience is no less demanding for us as we too need to make the journey without fear. In our baptism, we too "have found favor with God". As St. Paul writes, "In Him (Christ) we were also chosen" for some personal mission (perhaps big, perhaps small) as were Mary, Joseph, Peter, Paul, your aunt Margaret and your brother Steve. Advent is the church's way of reminding us to 'stay on point' no matter what is going on in the world.

The point is, this Advent as every Advent, we have a choice, just as Joseph and Mary had a choice. We can say "Yes", as they did, to all of the challenges and obstacles in moving our hearts from wherever we are at this moment to the spiritual Bethlehem which is our destination. The events of the world – while important and historical – are merely the backdrop which are little different than the historical events that this holy husband and wife experienced. God is calling all of us to be a type of Mary and Joseph. Truely hear the readings for this Second Sunday of Advent. May they convey what they intend - comfort in these times of discomfort; personal preparation for the one mightier than John who has already baptized us with the Spirit of God of love. In that love we are to serve Him by being heralds of Good News – "Crying out to the cities of Judah (and beyond), Here is your God!"

FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

The story of John the Baptist is the story of taking a back seat to Jesus, of fading into the background so that Jesus might be the light. Fading out of the picture is something we may find ourselves doing more than once in our lives. Sometimes it's also a choice we have to make, even when it's painful.

Actor Nick Nolte talked about what it was like for him when he turned seventy; how his body would hurt and how painful it was to get out of bed some mornings. He told of how he cried when a longtime friend passed away and of the sadness death brings. But the worst part, he said, is coming to the realization that your children have grown up, are on their own, and don't need you the way they once did. His son has a family, and for him the family comes first, as it should. That's the painful part, Nolte says, the letting go of your children because they are no longer yours; in reality, they never were.

From the perspective of faith, why do we need to fade into the background? To leave room for the hand of God in life, that's why. So that God can do what God does best, and so that we don't get in the way of it all. That is a task not only at the end of life but for all of life. •

Pope Francis speaks out against his critics in the U.S. Catholic Church

Pope Francis' comments came in a meeting with fellow Jesuits in Portugal, where one of the priests remarked that he had spent a year in the United States and was shocked by the anger directed at Pope Francis and where he often witnessed criticisms of Pope Francis' leadership by American bishops.

Pope Francis replied "The situation in the United States is not easy: there is a very strong reactionary attitude. It is organized and shapes the way people belong, even emotionally. Some people opt out; they go backward; they are what I call *indietristi*." When you go backwards, you form something closed, disconnected from the roots of the church and you lose the sap of revelation. If you don't change upward, you go backward, and then you take on criteria for change other than those our faith gives for growth and change. And the effects on morality are devastating."

Pope Francis concluded his remarks to the priest by saying "Those American groups you talk about, so closed, are isolating themselves. Instead of living by doctrine, by the true doctrine that always develops and bears fruit, they live by ideologies. When you abandon doctrine in life to replace it with an ideology, you have lost, you have lost as in war."
