# INTRODUCTION

Welcome to your first year of Confirmation preparation at Good Shepherd Church. We are looking forward to sharing with you this journey of faith as you prepare to receive the sacrament of Confirmation. As you will know, Confirmation preparation involves learning, sharing, serving, fellowship, spiritual growth and fun! You will be given the opportunity to learn more about your Catholic faith and what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ.

What is Confirmation? Confirmation is one of the Sacraments of Initiation. While Baptism is the first step of initiation into the life of the Church, Confirmation can be seen as the completion of the Baptismal commitment. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "The reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace" (no. 1285). There are two primary effects from the sacrament of Confirmation: strengthening of one's bond with the Church, and reception of the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

The following guide details the requirements and expectations of Good Shepherd Church for those youth enrolled in Confirmation preparation as well as the expectations of parents and sponsors. This commitment involves the whole family and we ask that you carefully examine the expectations.

# WHO MAY BE CONFIRMED?

Confirmation candidates must:

- 1. Have received the sacraments of Baptism and Eucharist.
- 2. Be between the ages of twelve and eighteen.
- 3. Have been adequately catechized (prepared) in the Roman Catholic faith. This is usually accomplished through ongoing participation in a Roman Catholic parish or school-sponsored religious education program.
- 4. Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the obligations of a practicing member of the Catholic Church.
- 5. Have a sincere desire to receive the sacrament as well as an appreciation of sacramental life.
- 6. Have sincerely attempted to fulfill the expectations as outlined in this guidebook.



# **EXPECTATIONS FOR CONFIRMATION CANDIDATES**

The following explains each of the Confirmation expectations in detail and in some cases, the reasons the requirements are important to the formation of the candidate. Please remember that while in many cases we list a minimum requirement for Confirmation, the candidates should be encouraged to make many of these activities a regular part of their faith practices.

- Openness to the guidance of the Holy Spirit in deciding directions and priorities in life.
- Openness to the guidance and appreciation of the efforts of The Church of the Good Shepherd as a community of faith and a willingness to participate in that community.
- Regular participation in the worshipping community making the Eucharist a priority.
- Consistent participation in Faith Group gatherings, service projects and daily prayer.
- Consider selecting an appropriate sponsor that can participate, support and guide the candidate in their faith not just today but ongoing.
- Consider choosing a confirmation name that has meaning to you (It must be a Saint)
- Demonstrate a commitment to Christian Service as a way of life. A generous spirit of service is at the heart of this requirement.
- Be an active participant in all aspects of the preparation process; what you put into this process is what you will get out of this process.



# **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARENTS**

"As the primary educators of their children: parents are to be intimately involved in the catechesis for Confirmation. This will help them renew and strengthen their own faith, besides enabling them to set a better example for their children." (NCD, no. 119)

All parents are expected to:

- 1. Ensure that their candidate participates in Mass regularly, ideally with the entire family.
- 2. Being actively involved in the Confirmation preparation of the candidate.
- 3. Engaging in discussions about the material being studied, including sharing your understanding and perspective.
- 4. Praying for your child's spiritual growth every day.
- 5. Supporting and encouraging completion of assignments, activities and expectations.
- 6. Faithfully bringing your teen (and when necessary yourself) to, classes, retreats, meetings and special events.
- 7. Volunteer for retreats, service work, meetings, classes, spiritual events and/or social events.
- 8. Model responsible and active church membership for your child.

# What is the Purpose of a Confirmation Name?

When deciding on a Confirmation name, the goal is to pick the name of a Saint you admire, can relate to or aspire to be like. This saint will be bonded to you spiritually and will be your model in life and can be the one you turn to for guidance and protection. Throughout the Bible there are many examples of people taking on new names, dating back to the Old Testament. God changed the names of many to reflect the special roles they'd play throughout the history of the church. For example, God changed Abram's name to Abraham meaning "father to a host of nations". This name change signified that God was making a covenant with Abraham that would make him the first of God's people on earth. Simon's name was changed to Peter, meaning "rock" and refers to Peter becoming the first Pope: "and upon this rock I will build my church" (Matthew 16:17-18)

# **Choosing a Saint Confirmation Name**

There are thousands of Saints, How do I choose? To help you narrow down your choices to the one St who is your ideal match, consider the following:

# Pick up a book on saints

Pick up a book on Saints and read about the lives of popular Saints who had a profound impact on the church. The trials and tribulations that Saints experienced, as well as their triumphs and examples of faith, can be a great source of inspiration for your own life.

#### Hobbies and Causes

Do you have a hobby or a worthy cause that you are passionate about? Search for the Saint who shares your similar goals and interests. There is a patron Saint for practically every cause. For example, if you have a special connection to animals, consider choosing the name Francis (after the great animal lover Saint Francis of Assisi) If you're looking for a Saint who lived an exemplary life of

selflessness, Saint Maximilian Kobe is a great example. During World War 2 he gave up his life for another person's life in a German concentration camp. If music is your passion, Saint Cecilia, patron Saint of musicians may interest you.

# Maybe a virtue like Bravery or Courage?

Find a virtue that a particular Saint exhibited that connects with you; Bravery, obedience, charity, patience, or courage. Do you find yourself standing up for those who need a little help? Maybe you should pick Saint Michael! Are you well versed in bedside manner? Your Saint name would be Agatha for sure!

# Need Help? Pray!

If you've narrowed down your choices and are stuck and can't decide, pray! Ask God to shed his light on who He thinks is the best name for you.

#### God Given Saint Name

If your first name (baptismal name) is a Saints name, the church allows you to use it as your confirmation name. Doing so is actually encouraged because it's a symbolic way of recalling your baptism. Before you receive the sacrament, pray to the Saints who's name you will be using as your confirmation name. Ask the Saint to help you to make moral choices and to be your intercessor before God whenever you call on him or her for assistance. After receiving the sacrament, don't forget about your namesake! Remember to continue to seek his or her protection and guidance.

#### Visual Reminders

Set up visual reminders of your saintly namesake throughout your home, office, or in your car. Prayer cards, statues, books, and jewelry of your Saint will help you stay connected and to form is stronger bond.

#### REFLECTIONS OF THE CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST

The Sunday liturgy (Mass) is the gathering of the faithful to pray and give praise to God.

During the liturgy we hear the word of God proclaimed, the celebrant or deacon shares his thoughts on the Word and we are to take the Word with us as we leave the church.

One way for us to truly live out the Word of God is to spend time reflecting on what those words mean to us.

Each candidate, with the help of his/her parent(s) must write a reflection on the Gospel and homily for 4 masses during the year.

Suggestions on how to write these papers:

Bring a pad of paper with you to church and write down some thoughts or words you hear in the Gospel and homily.

Write down the scripture reference (ie: Luke 5:1-5) of the Gospel so you can refer back to it when you are writing your paper.

Discuss what you heard and wrote down on the way home in the car, asking everyone to participate.

Ask yourself and your family what the Scripture and homily have to do with your life today.

When you get home, write your reflection while it's fresh in your mind.

Remember, this is a reflection paper; what you write is what you feel the Scripture is saying to you at this moment in your life's journey.
